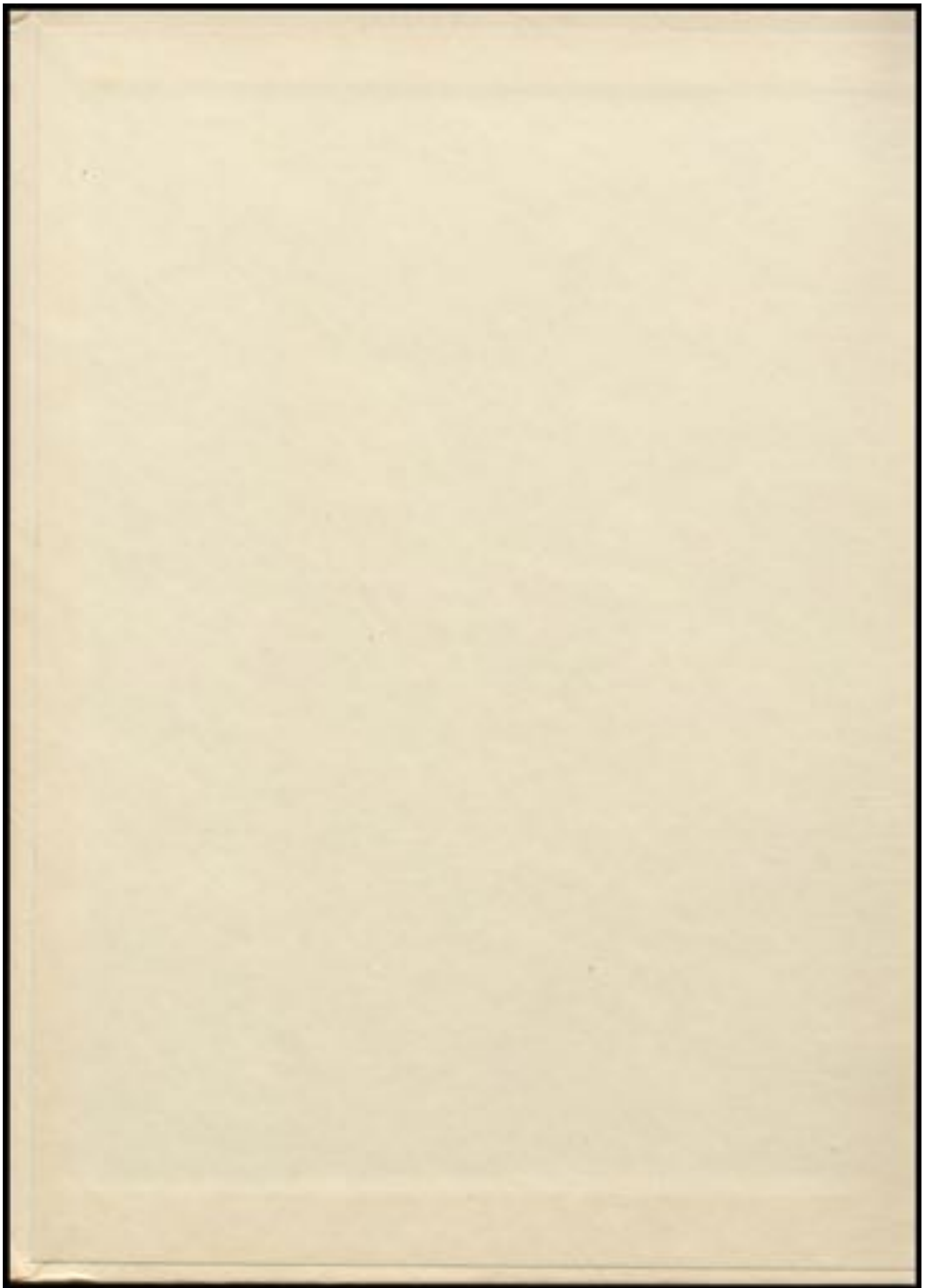

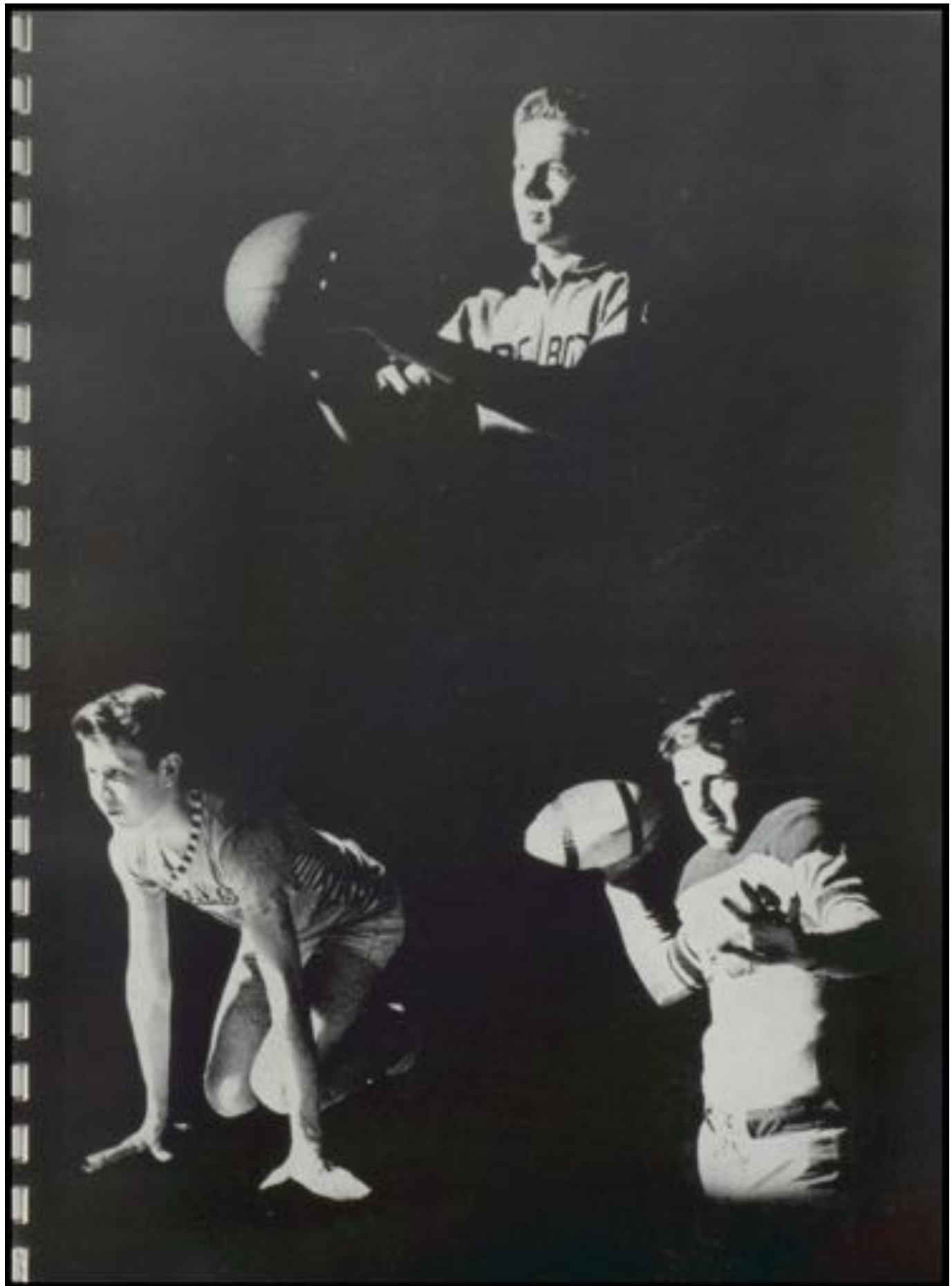

Nevertheless, all members of the Trojan team put in wonderful performances, and had no apologies to make.

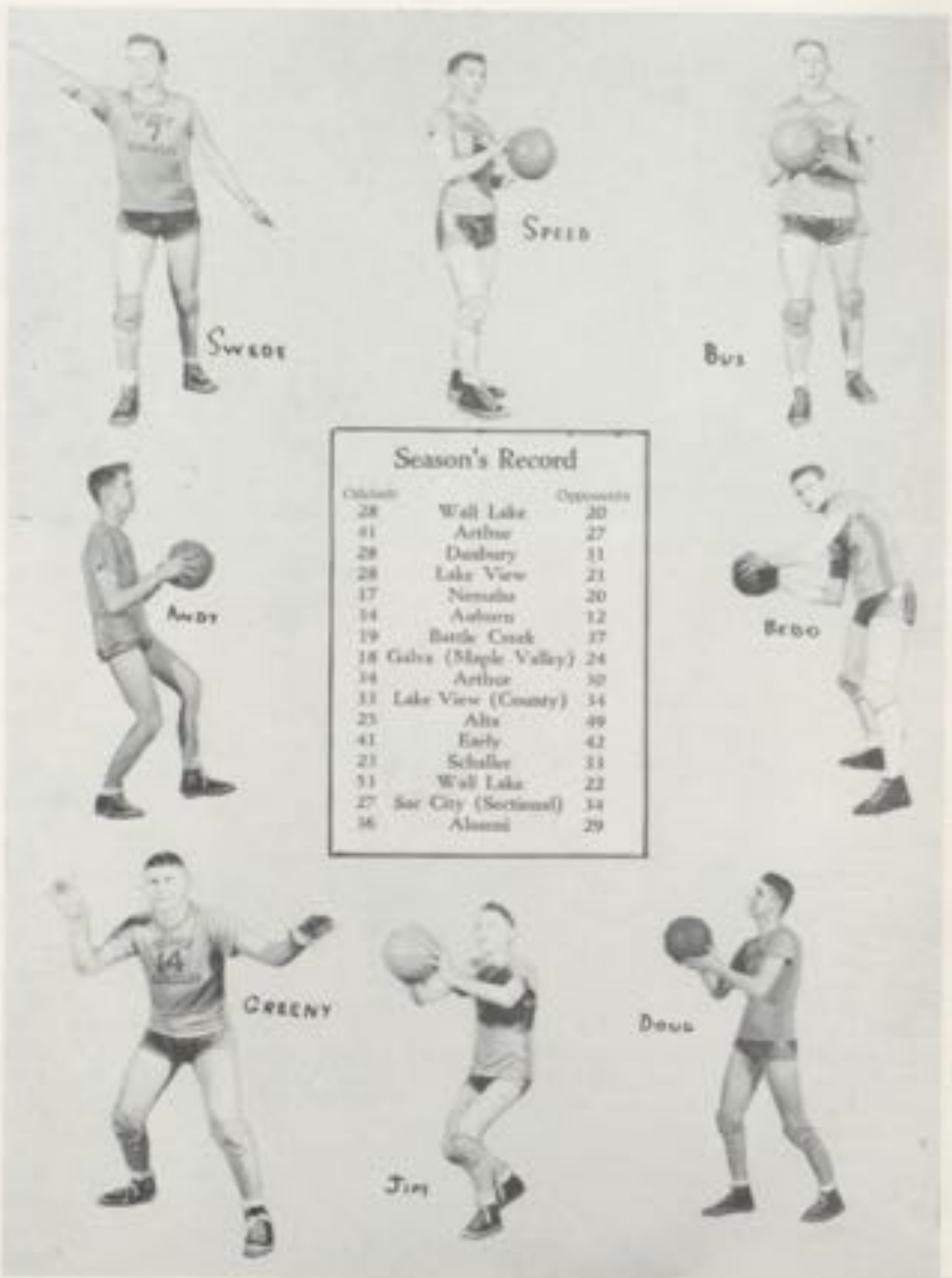

Boys' Basketball

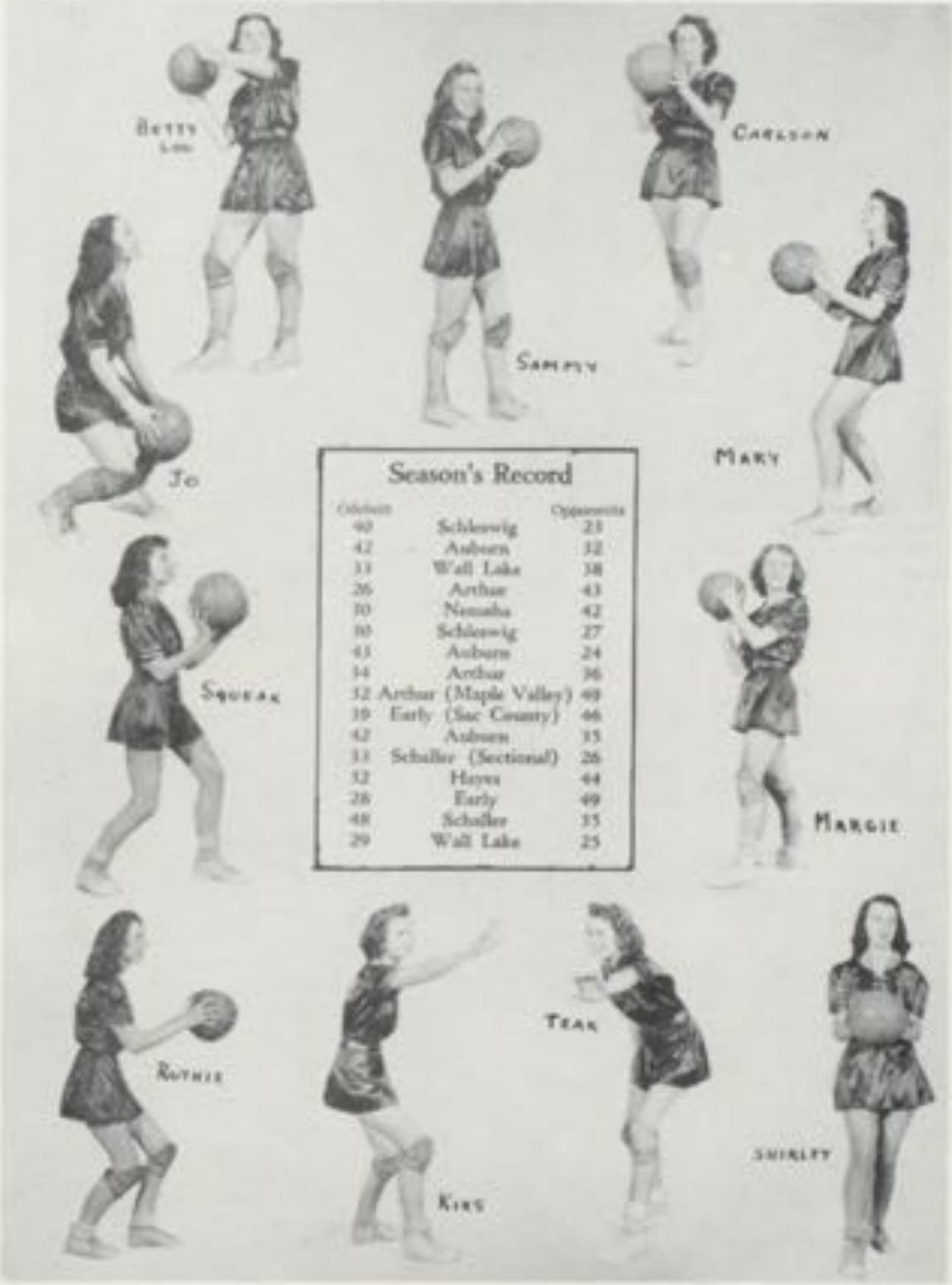

Girls' Basketball

The Odebolt girls' basketball team enjoyed their most successful season since 1942-1943 playing sixteen games and winning eight and losing eight.

No doubt their most surprising victory came February 19 when they upset Wall Lake 29-25. Consolation honors in the Sac County girls' tournament were taken by the Odebolt squad.

Individual scoring honors went to the following girls: Jo Bye, 117 points; Isabelle Hunt, 110 points; Mary Bengford, 103 points; Joan Einspahr, 100; Shirley Siebrecht, 86; and Ruth Kessler 48. The girls averaged 35.6 points per game this season

while the Odebolt guards held the opponents to a like average.

The Trojan Track team began workouts in the middle of March, with only four returning lettermen among the forty candidates. Since Odebolt's enrollment was just over the Class B limit of 150 students we became Class A for the first year at the Holstein Relays. Despite the strenuous efforts of the Trojans, the keen Class A competition outpointed them. The Trojan two-mile and the medley Relay were taken to the Tomahawk Relays at Cherokee, the two-mile relay placing fifth there. We then participated in the Sac Invitational meet, gaining two firsts in relays and two in individual events. The two-mile relay was then taken to the Sioux City Relays and again gained fifth place. Our other meets included Maple Valley Conference meet where we

placed second in the meet, with the two-mile relay setting a new record, and our 880 yard run and 440 yard relay placing first. We placed in everything except the 220 run and pole vault. Six men went to Fort Dodge May 7 to the District Track Meet. The two mile relay composed of Harold Anderson, Doyle Hansen, Tom Sommers, and Bob Hansen got first and will go to the state meet May 22. Bob Hansen also qualified in the 880 yard run by getting a first and Harold Anderson, by getting a second in the 440 yard run. George Hummel placed in the football throw and Dick Morr, in the broad jump.

Odebolt will also go to the Sac Relays May 14, and to the state May 22.

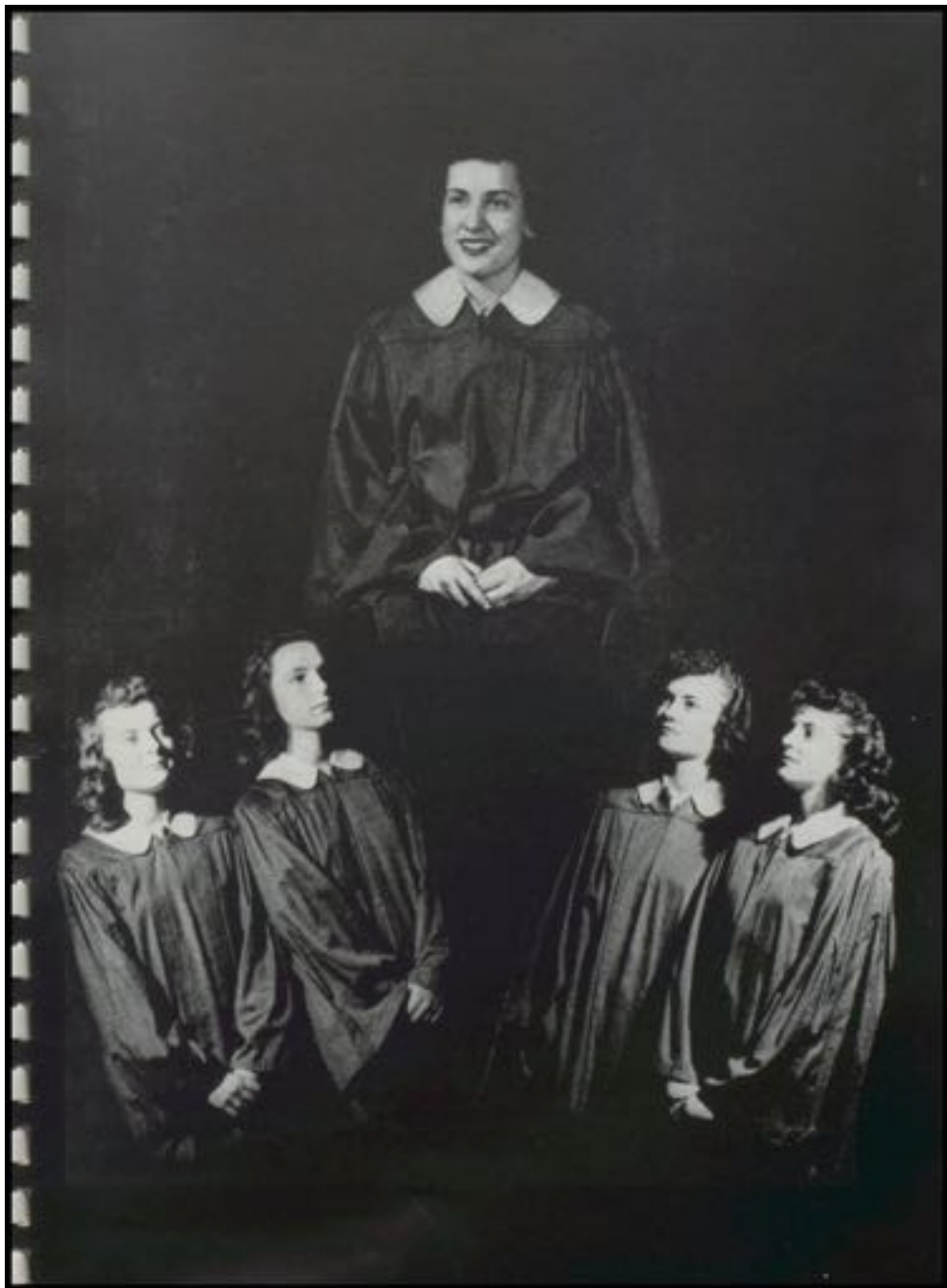

The Future Farmers of America, or F. F. A. as it is commonly called, is the national organization of, by, and for boys studying Vocational Education.

The Odebolt Chapter of Future Farmers of America has 28 active members and six honorary members. We have the honor of having two members of our chapter,

Lyle Teaquist and John Huldeen, who have been awarded the highest degree of membership, namely the American Farmer degree. Clyde Meyer, a member of our chapter, is State Vice-President of the Iowa Association F. F. A. from the Northwest district. This year all students enrolled in the Agriculture course and also four who are now out of school belong to the F. F. A.



The kindergarten, first six grades, and Junior High School are housed in the yellow brick building which was dedicated in 1899 and which for years was The School House. The Senior High Building is still called the New Building although it was erected in 1930 and is already overcrowded and inadequate in some respects. The Odebolt Public School has a total enrollment of 236 - 141 in the grade school, 82 in Junior High and 113 in Senior High. Many of these pupils come from rural areas and are brought in by four school buses which are owned by the school and are driven by Reverend Erroy Anderson, Harry Selby, William Sykes and Kenneth Wingert. The territory covered by the buses extends seven miles north, five miles east, three miles west, and twelve miles south of Odebolt. Some students come from points beyond these limits but they provide their own transportation.

The school is accredited by the North Central Association and offers courses in Smith-Hughes Vocational Agriculture and Vocational Homemaking. The course of study is broken up into General, Commercial, and Vocational Agriculture curricula, with a distinction being made in the eleventh and twelfth grades. The General Course prepares for college and offers English, Social Science, Laboratory Science, Mathematics, Latin, Speech,

and Homemaking. The Commercial Course consists of Typing and Shorthand in the eleventh year, and Bookkeeping and Bookkeeping in the twelfth year, in addition to general requirements and electives from other courses. A one-semester course in General Typing is open to all students. The Vocational Agriculture program includes Livestock and Crop Production, Farm Management, and Farm Mechanics.

Two years of Homemaking are offered and include foods, food preservation, clothing, food preservation, clothing, personal grooming, child care, home furnishings, health and home care of the sick, and family relationships.

Physics and Chemistry are offered in alternate years as electives for eleventh and twelfth grade students. Both are basic courses for further study in college and each requires three recitation and two laboratory periods weekly.

In the field of English, English Literature is offered in the eleventh grade, and American Literature in the twelfth, and Speech is open to both upper classes. A course in College Preparatory grammar replaced Speech in the second semester.

The Odell schools place much emphasis on training in music. The Junior Band consists of beginning students from fourth grade to high school and Senior Band is

composed of those pupils who have developed to the level of proficiency required of all members. Individual lessons are given to those who desire them and earn them. The large vocal music groups are Mixed Chorus and Girls' Glee Club, and they and several smaller groups appear many times during the school year in concerts and on programs throughout the community.



World History

The physical education department gives letters to boys in the three major sports—football, basketball, and track. Much interest has been developed in football and basketball in Junior High also, and the teams organized in those grades have enjoyed a good season. For all Junior and Senior High School girls, the physical education department provides group games, touch football, softball, basketball, volleyball, and some track.



Physics

Minimum requirements for graduation are English, three years; Mathematics, Algebra I and Geometry; Social Science, two years, of which a minimum of one semester of U. S. History and one semester of Government is required; Home-making I for girls and either Vocational Agriculture I or Industrial Arts I for boys. Electives must be taken for completion of sixteen units of work, the necessary credit for graduation as required by the North Central Association, the crediting agency to which Odessa High School belongs.

We reprint here the original manuscript, written by James Barkley, a sophomore, and delivered by him in the Radio Speaking division of the State Declamatory contest. Since the topic is local in its character, we thought you would enjoy it.

TWO STORIES FOR ONE NAME

Today I am going to tell you a story, a story which has two versions about the naming of a town, the town of ODEBOLT. I must give the credit for these stories to a former Odebolt boy, the late Eric McKinley Ericsson, historian and teacher. Professor Ericsson spent a great deal of time in historical research in Iowa, and because it was his hometown, he was particularly interested in early day stories of Odebolt. The legends about the naming of the town must have intrigued him, because he did some extensive investigating to find records that were authentic to prove that one or the other of the stories was true. Unfortunately he was never able to find the proof for which he sought.

The pioneers crossing the state of Iowa when it was a vast uncolonized, rolling prairie were of many nationalities, English, Dutch, Swedish, German, and French. Sickness and death crossed the grasslands with them; Indians raided and burned; the winters were bitter cold and the summers terrifically hot. But their greatest crisis did not arise from these causes; breakdowns in which possessions and time were lost were most common, and these breakdowns often came during the fording of rivers and small streams.

One day a wagon came bringing a German family seeking a location for a new home in America. Their style of traveling was very crude but common to the time, for they bumped along in anything but comfort in their old covered wagon. They had had their share of troubles and as they came over the rise of ground just east of the present site of Odebolt, they saw, in dismay, a stream meandering across the prairie. From a distance it appeared to be wide, but as they came closer they saw to their relief that it was narrow and shallow and that fording it would not be difficult. They found a place to cross and drove into the water. But, once more, trouble was at hand, for suddenly they were brought to a jolting halt—the kingbolt had dropped out of the wagon. The driver climbed down from the wagon seat to see

what had happened. When he discovered the trouble he was heard to exclaim, "O—de—bolt". While he was trying to repair the damage other wagons pulled up and to the repeated questions about his misfortune he answered, "O—de—bolt". It is probable that he never knew that he was responsible for the naming of the stream and the town which later grew up near this point, Odebolt. That is the first version. The second you may find more logical and easier to believe.

About 1828, an early settler in Sac County, riding across the prairie, came upon a small cabin on the bank of the same stream. He stopped for rest and found there a young Frenchman, who seemed to be in great trouble. After some persuasion he told the settler a strange story of his wife and child and the man who had stolen them, and how, because he had killed the man, he had been forced to leave France and so had come to western Iowa, a fugitive, working for a fur-trading company. The man's name was Jean Odebeau. He was strange and wild looking with long black hair, protrudent eyes, a bushiness, and stoop-shoulders. He was not at all friendly, and so as soon as settlers began to stake out their claims near his cabin he went away, leaving behind his fantastic story and his name. For the creek was called Odebeau's creek, and the name gradually grew into its present form, Odebolt. The unfortunate part about this account is that no one ever seemed to know who the settler was, and the American Fur Trading company for whom Odebeau was supposed to be trapping had no record of any such man.

There they are, two legends concerning the naming of a small stream and town on the western Iowa prairie. That town probably never will achieve metropolitan proportions but it has at least one claim to fame—it is the only town in the United States having that name. With such legends as the basis for it, no other town has any right to that name.
