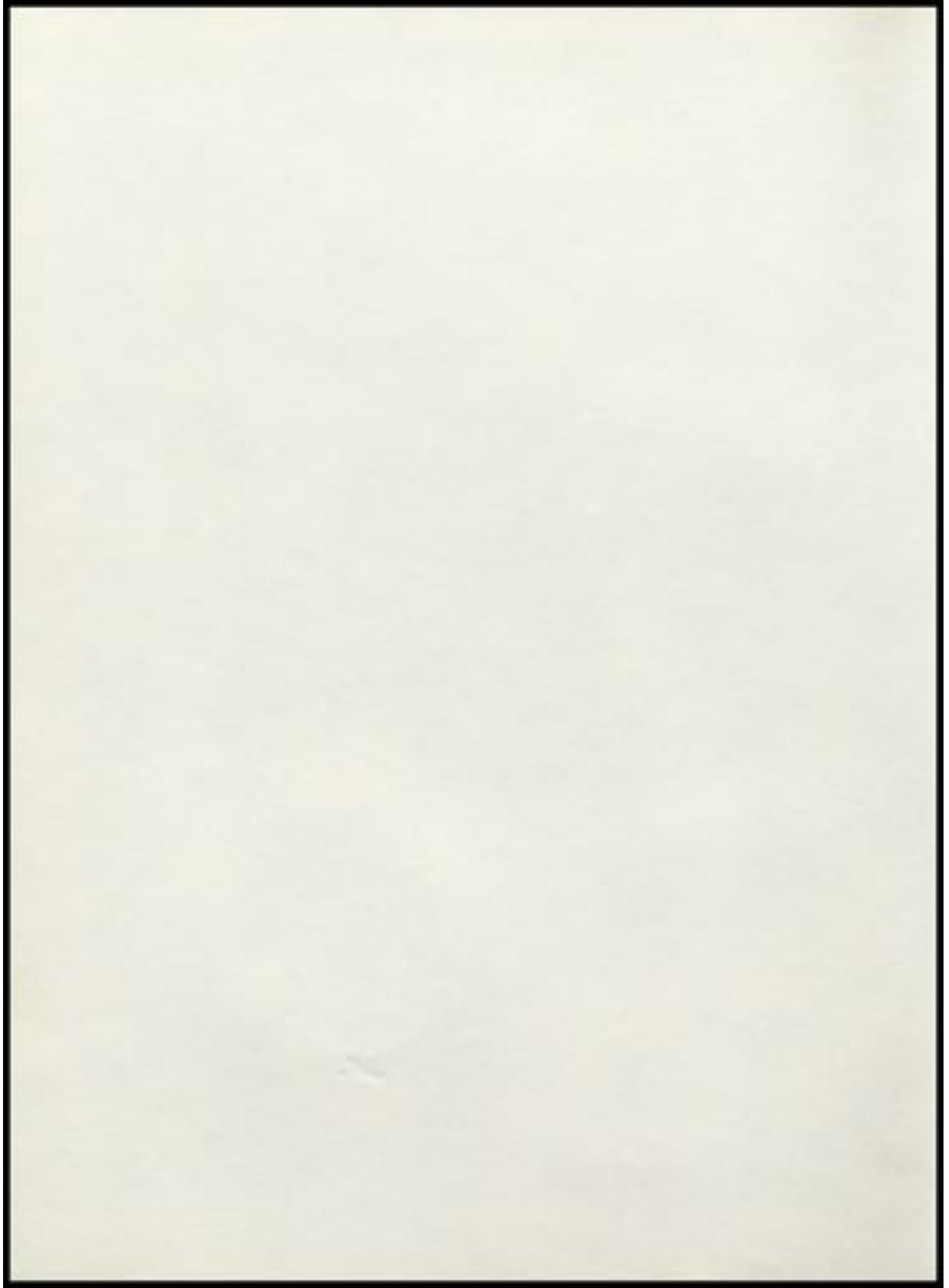

Foreword

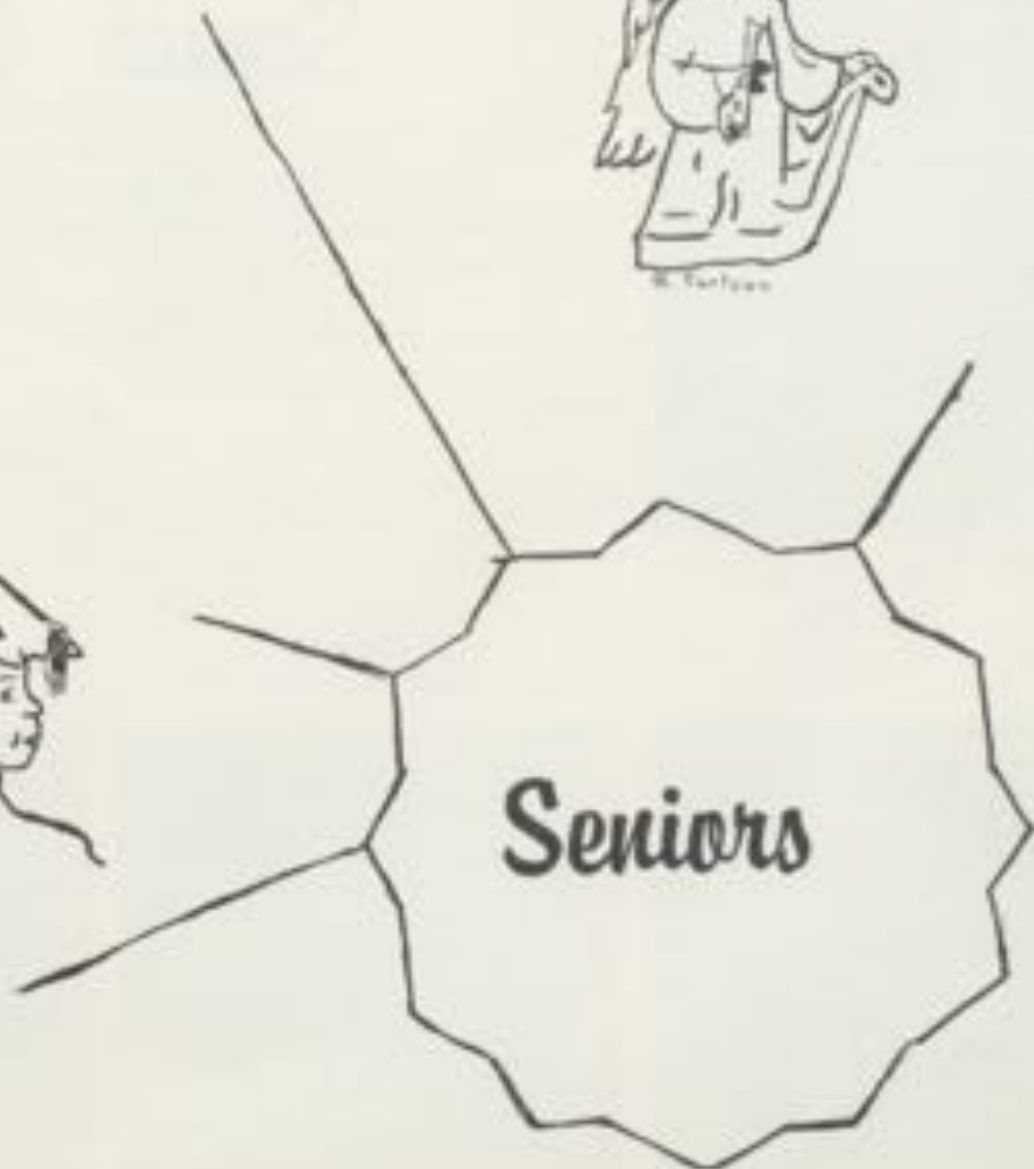
As students of Odebolt-Arthur, we have received the benefits that can be obtained only from attending a fine school.

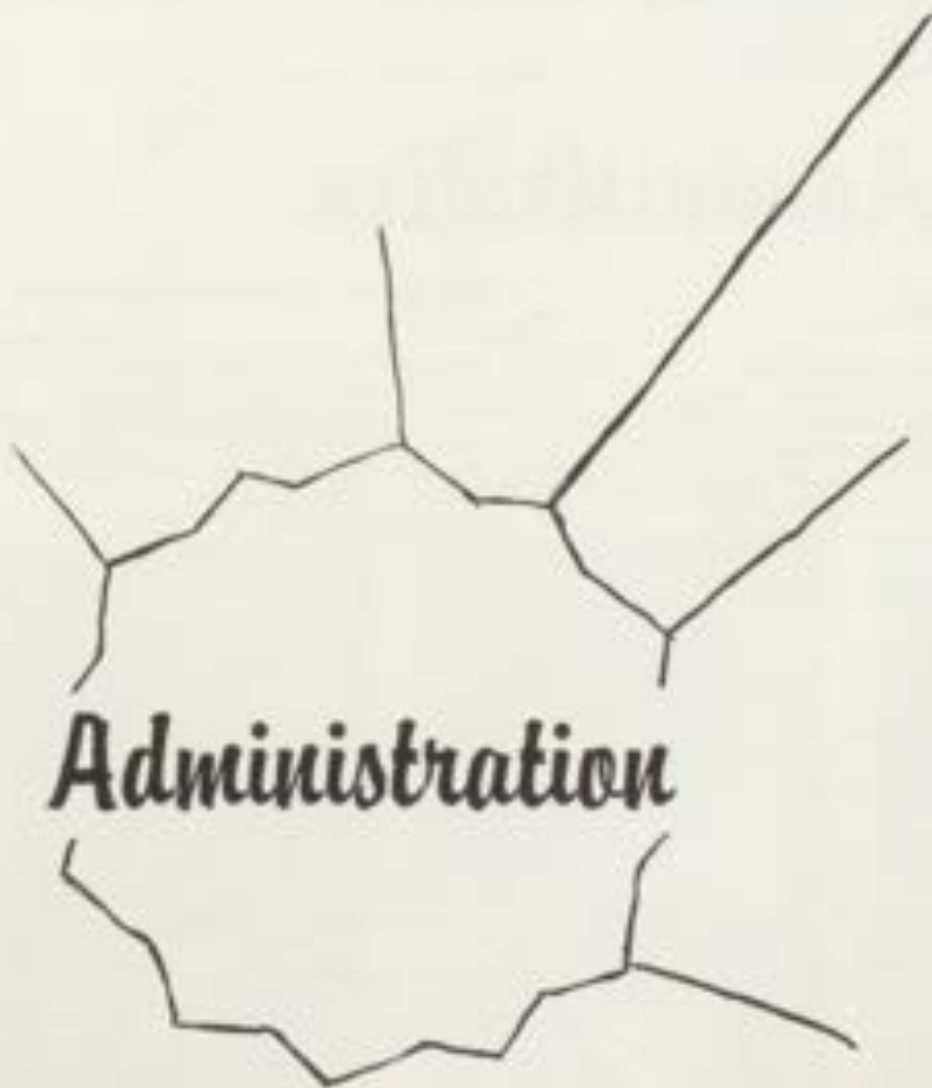
