


# Foreword



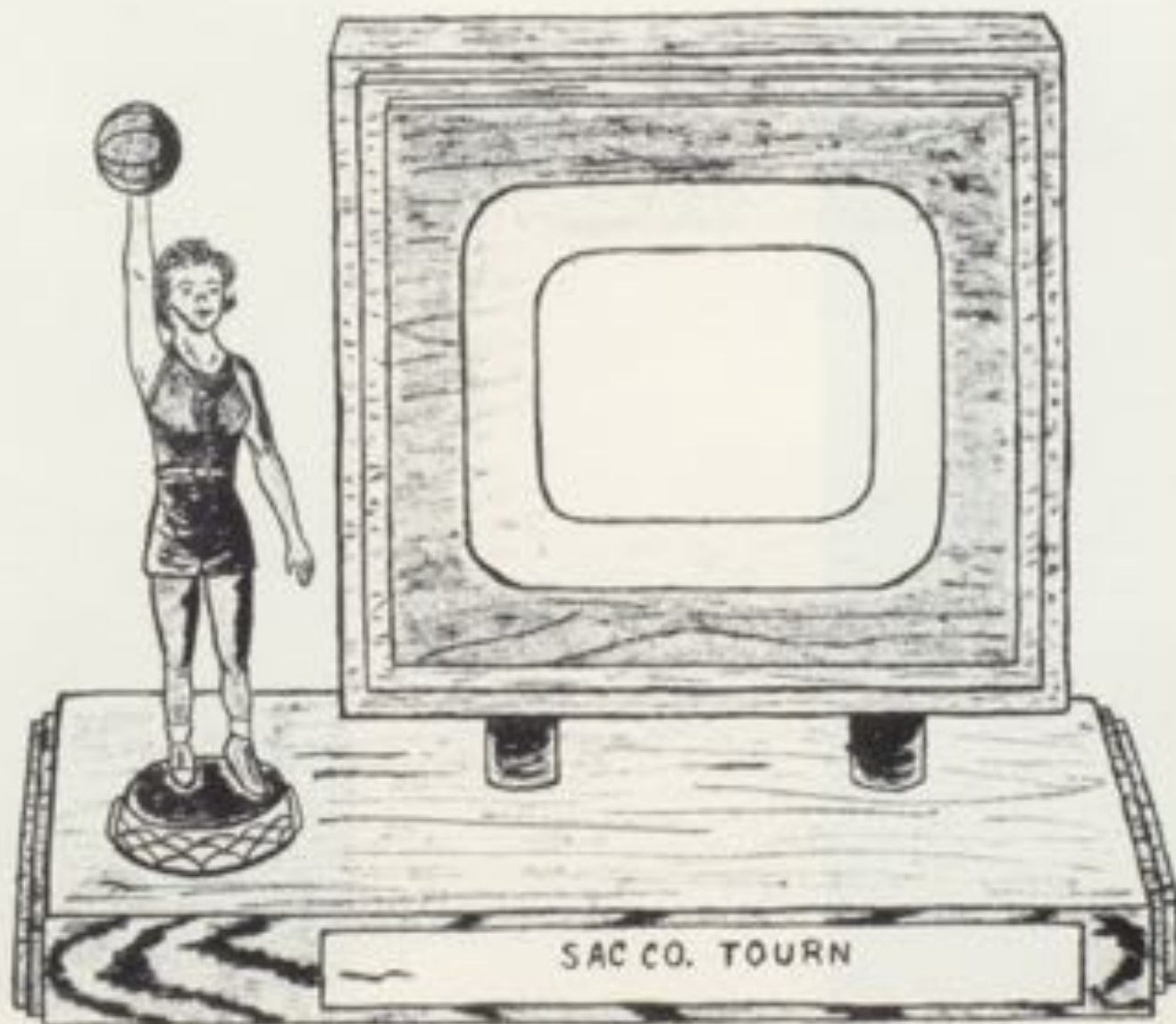

The team this year finished third in the Maple Valley Conference and second in the Sac County Tournament.

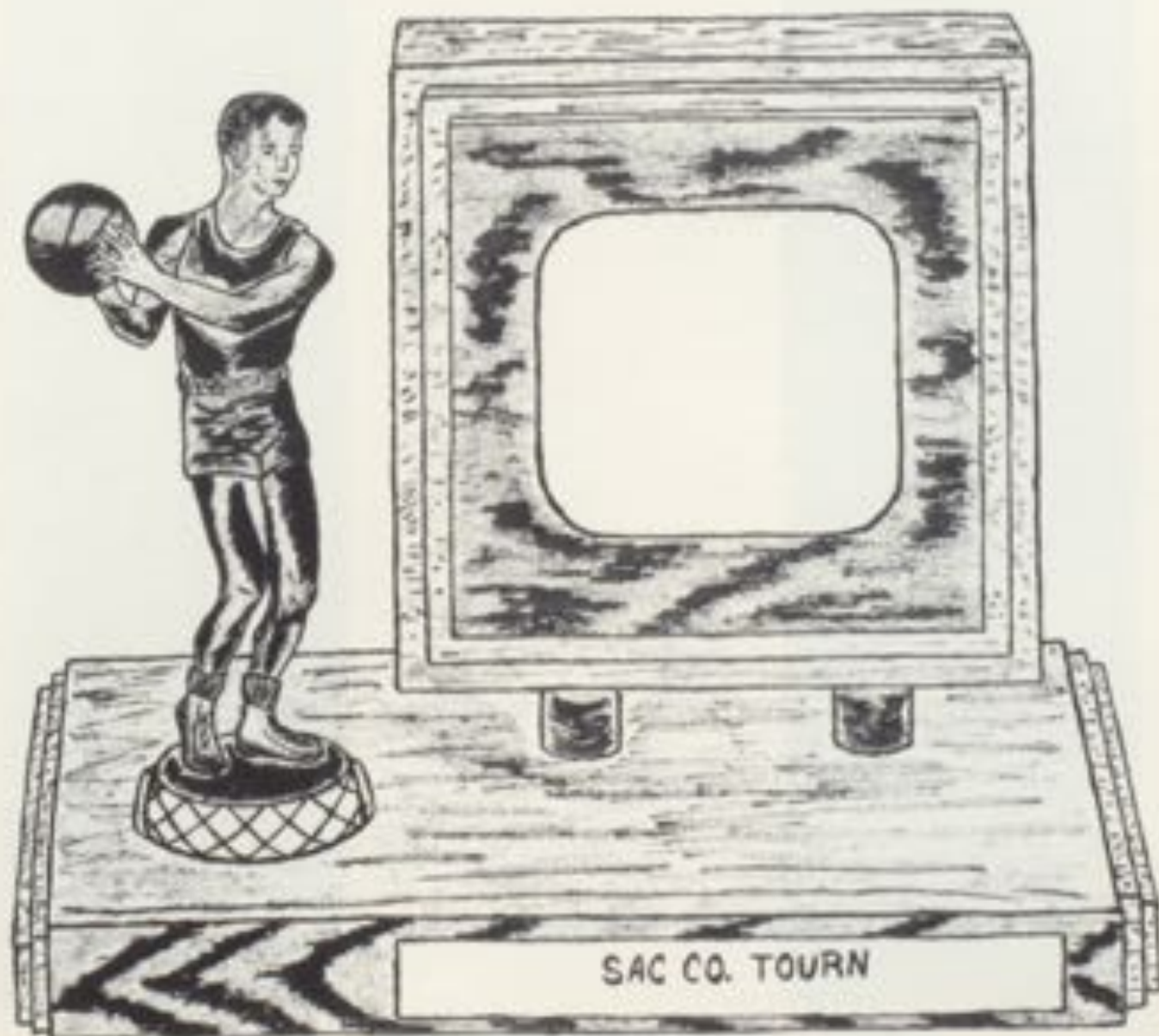
The offensive average for the Trojans was 53.2 and the defensive average, 52.1.

The local thirteens won four championships, and placed high in other meets as well. Eight school records fell and were replaced by the efforts of this year's fine team. 

Our members raised 121 litters of hogs, 250 head of feeder pigs, 117 head of beef feeders, 35 head of beef cows, 4 dairy cows, 114 ewes, and 354 acres of crops. During the year, we had judging teams represent the chapter at the Sioux City Hog Show, Sac City Market Show, Iowa State Fair, Ford Dodge Market Hog Show and Grain Judging Contest. Doyle Herrig was high individual over all in the grain-judging contest. Delegates attended the State FFA Convention in Waterloo, and the National FFA Convention in Kansas City.

Officers for the year are: President, Ron Bergman; Vice-president, Bob Hanson; Secretary, Chuck Carstensen; Treasurer, Bloyce Johnson; Reporter, Larry Johnson; Sentinel, Zane Johnson. Our two major sources of income are the sale of citrus fruit and the farming of 19 acres of land.

We entered all events in the FFA Contest in Program of Work, Parliamentary Procedure, Creed Speaking, Extemporaneous Speaking, Public Speaking, Secretary's Record; Treasurer's Record, and Scrapbook. We believe that this has been a fine year for the chapter, which, in its activities, has held its own in competition with other chapters.
