

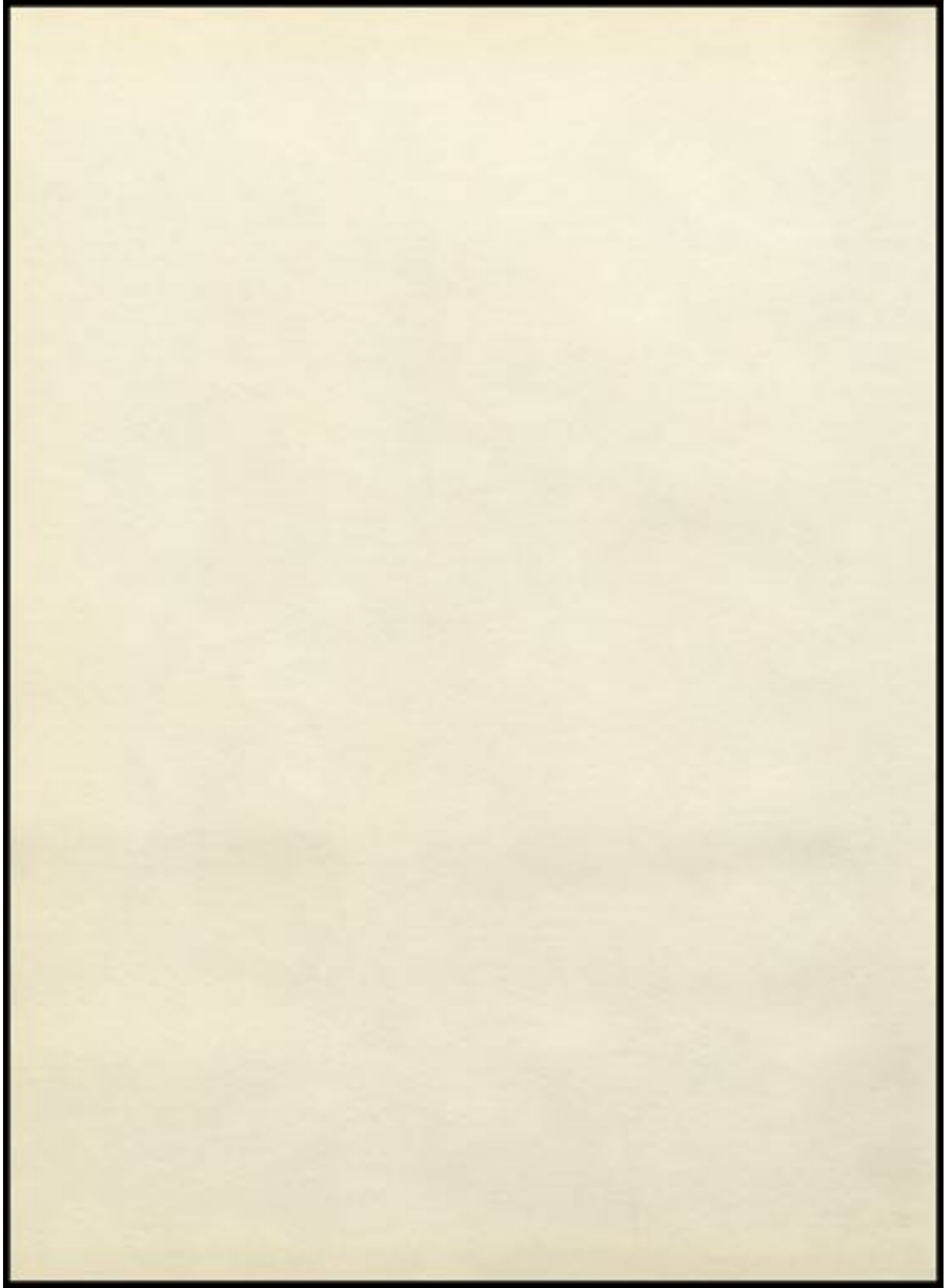

We also had contest teams at the Dairy Cattle Congress, Grain judging, Sioux City Livestock Show, Sac City Market Hog show, Fort Dodge Market hog show, and Arc Welding contest. We attempt to give as many members as possible a chance to compete by preparing for contest by classes.

We entered all events in FFA contest competition. The Northwest District FFA contest was held at our school on March 7 this year. This has been a prosperous and challenging year for our FFA chapter, and we take pride in its activities and accomplishments.

The Odebolt-Arthur TROJANS were considered one of the contenders for the Maple Valley Conference crown, and the pre-season challenge was accepted by the 54 squad members. Here is a brief recap of the nine Trojan games.

The Trojans opened against a big West Monona team. Odebolt-Arthur's speed was West Monona's downfall. A long pass play, a sustained drive, and a kickoff return put the Trojans out in front. Stiff defense near the goal line on two occasions carried the Trojans to victory.

Kingsley-Pierson: The 6-0 lead at halftime for Kingsley-Pierson tested the Trojans' ability to work under pressure. Odebolt-Arthur scored two touchdowns in the second half which brought the Trojans their second victory of the season.
