Ranger on Target—This is a photograph of the lunar surface taken by the Ranger 7 spacecraft prior to its impact on the moon July 31st. The area shown is about one and two-thirds miles on a side. The smallest craters are about 30 feet in diameter and 10 feet deep. Some of the large craters are about 500 feet in diameter.



Family Grieved—Gust Carlson, father of Dr. Paul Carlson, medical missionary slain by rebel troops in the Congo, dabbled at his own during a news conference in Los Angeles on November 24. He is flanked by his daughter and another son.

New Teen-Age Queen—Bettye Cannon Mizell, 17, of Baltimore was crowned the new Miss Teen-age America of 1965 in Dallas on November 11.

World's Fair at Night—The New York World's Fair attracted as many visitors at night as it did during the day following its April opening. The nighttime lights set off the beautiful pavilions constructed by many countries.





Democratic Floor—President Lyndon Johnson won the 1964 election by the greatest plurality and just over the total vote in U. S. history. Johnson became President at the assassination of John F. Kennedy in 1963.

Bobby's Battle for Fairness—Sen. Barry Goldwater was surrounded by fans at Knoxville, Tenn., all-past September 18 as he campaigned for the presidency on the Republican ticket. The conservative senator swept to a five-fifteen nomination at the convention in San Francisco.

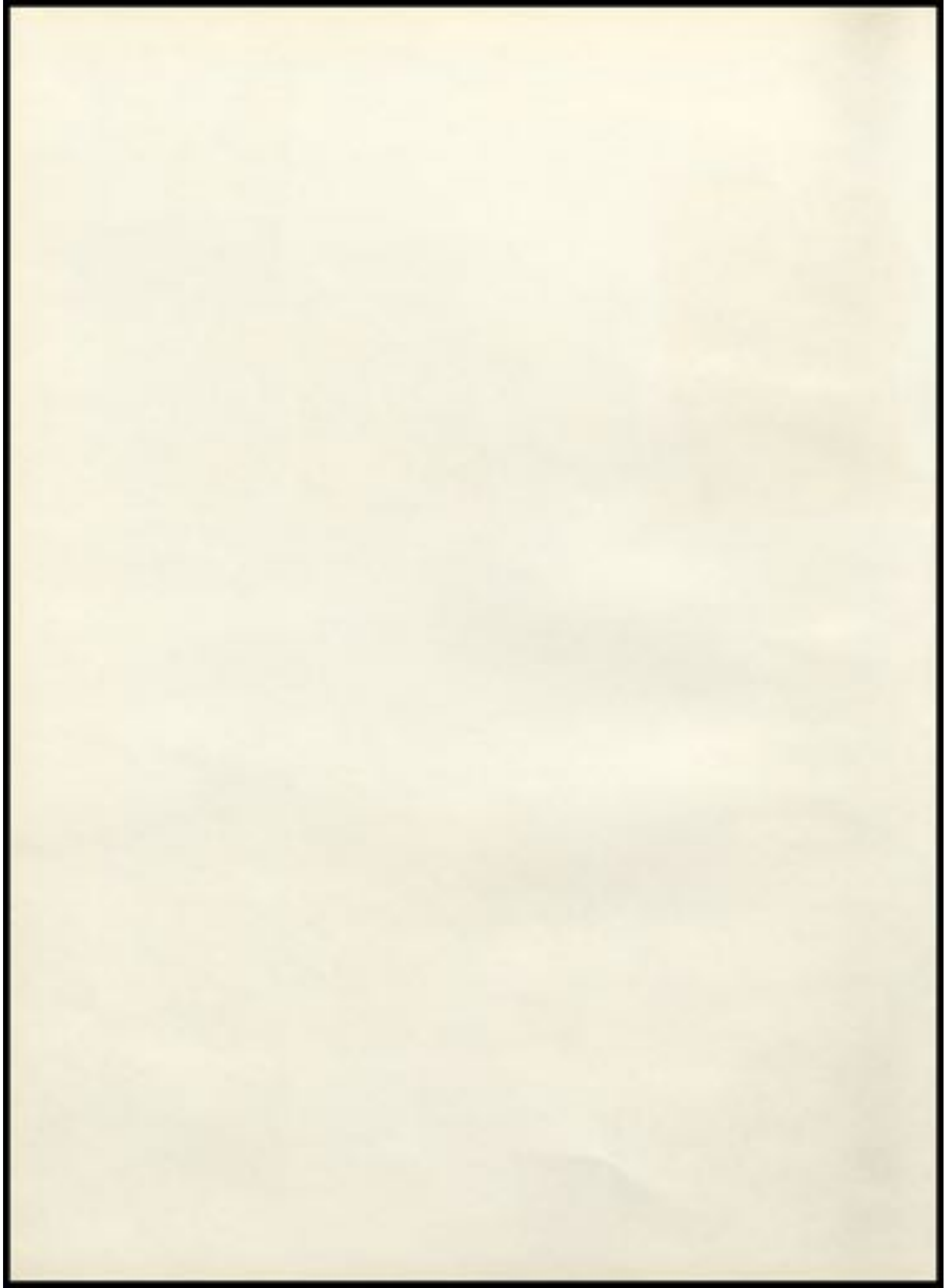

The graduates of Odebolt-Arthur High School may look back upon this school year as the time when the darkness of their ignorance suddenly was dispelled by the gleam of knowledge.

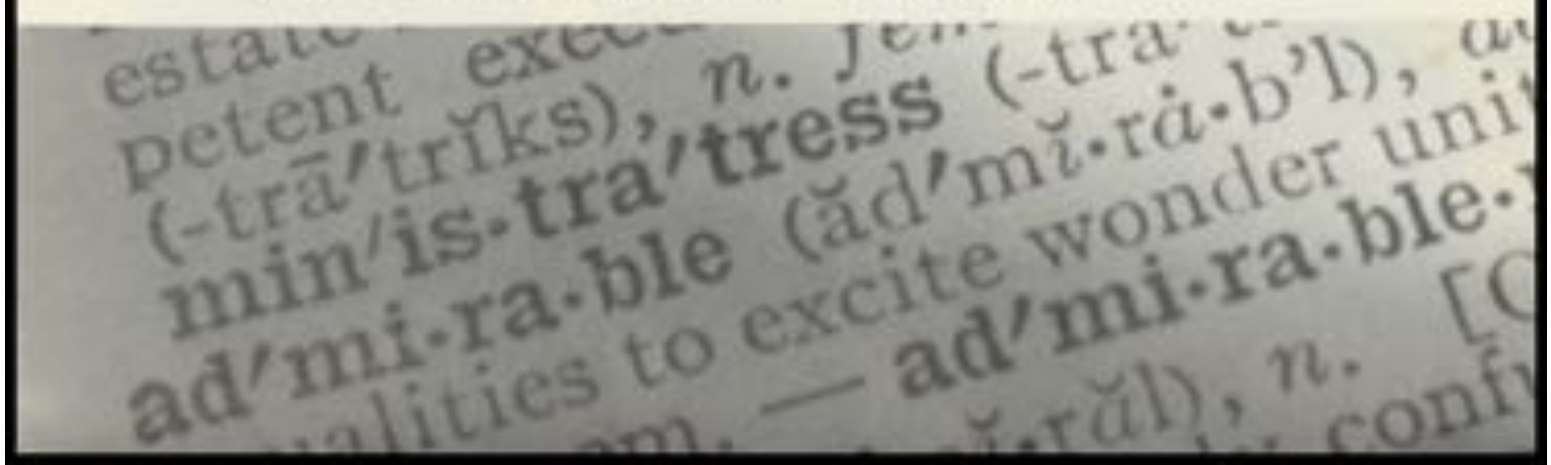

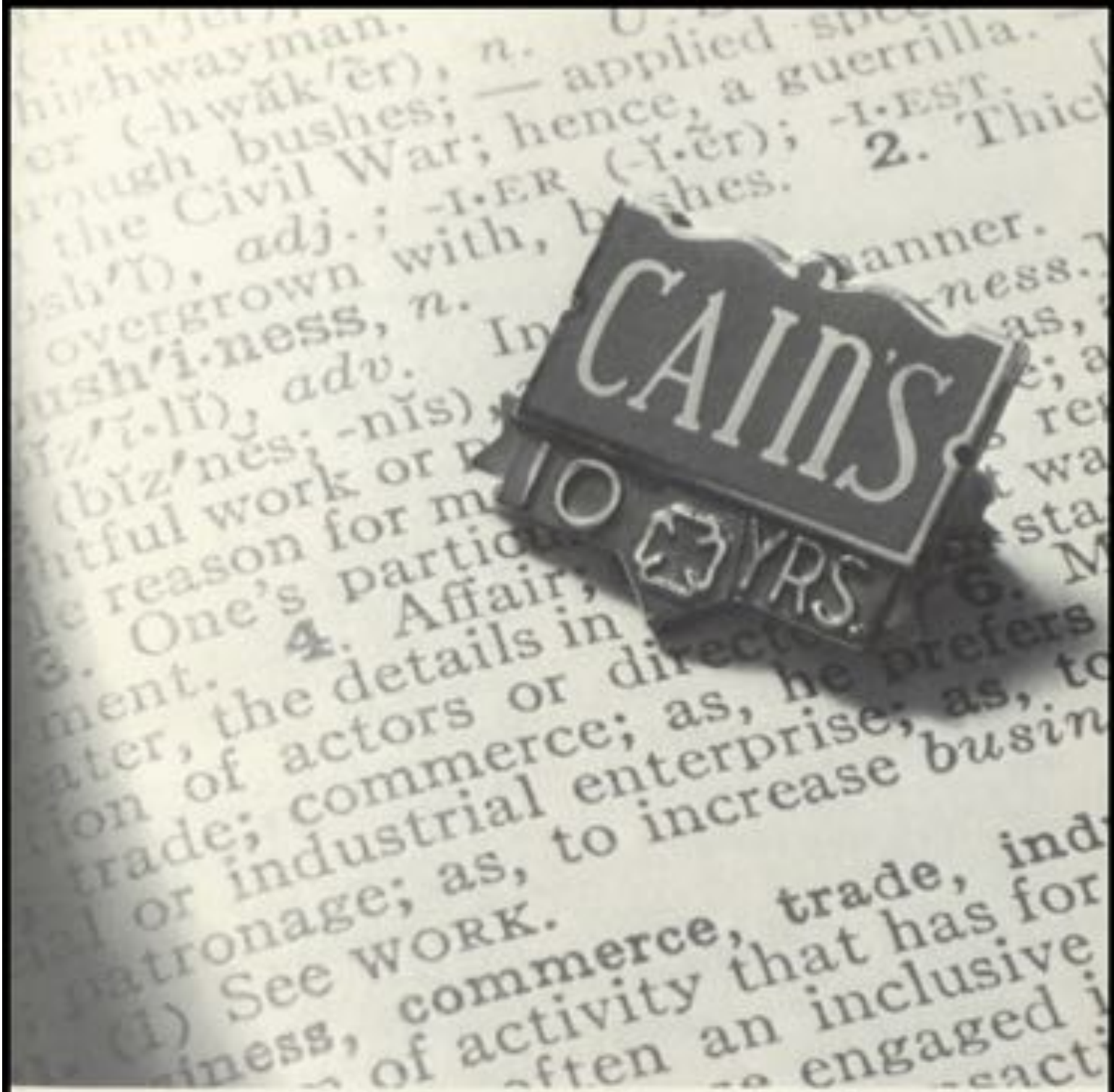
Baseball: Our Summer Interest

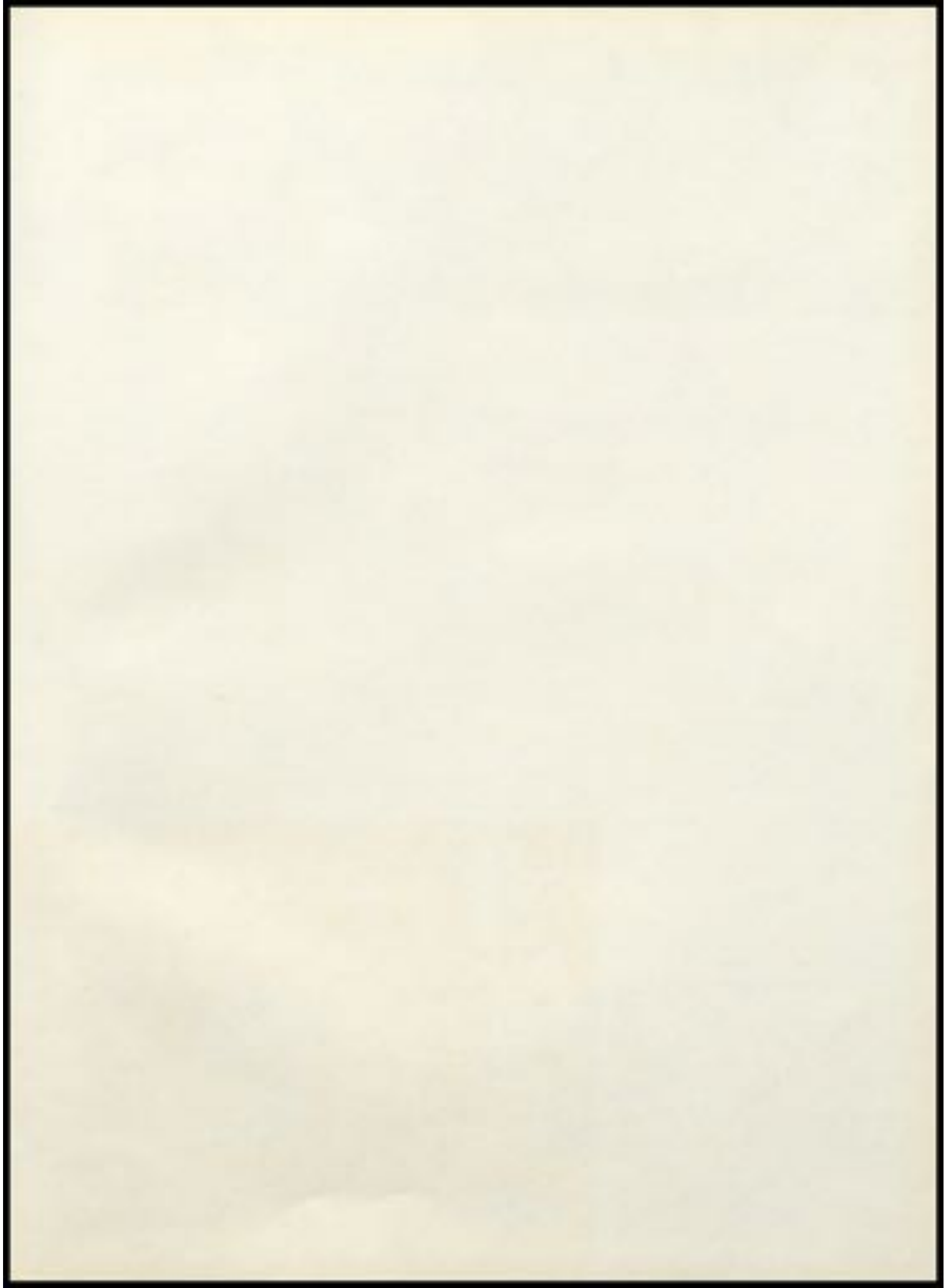
ACKNOWLEDGEMENT
