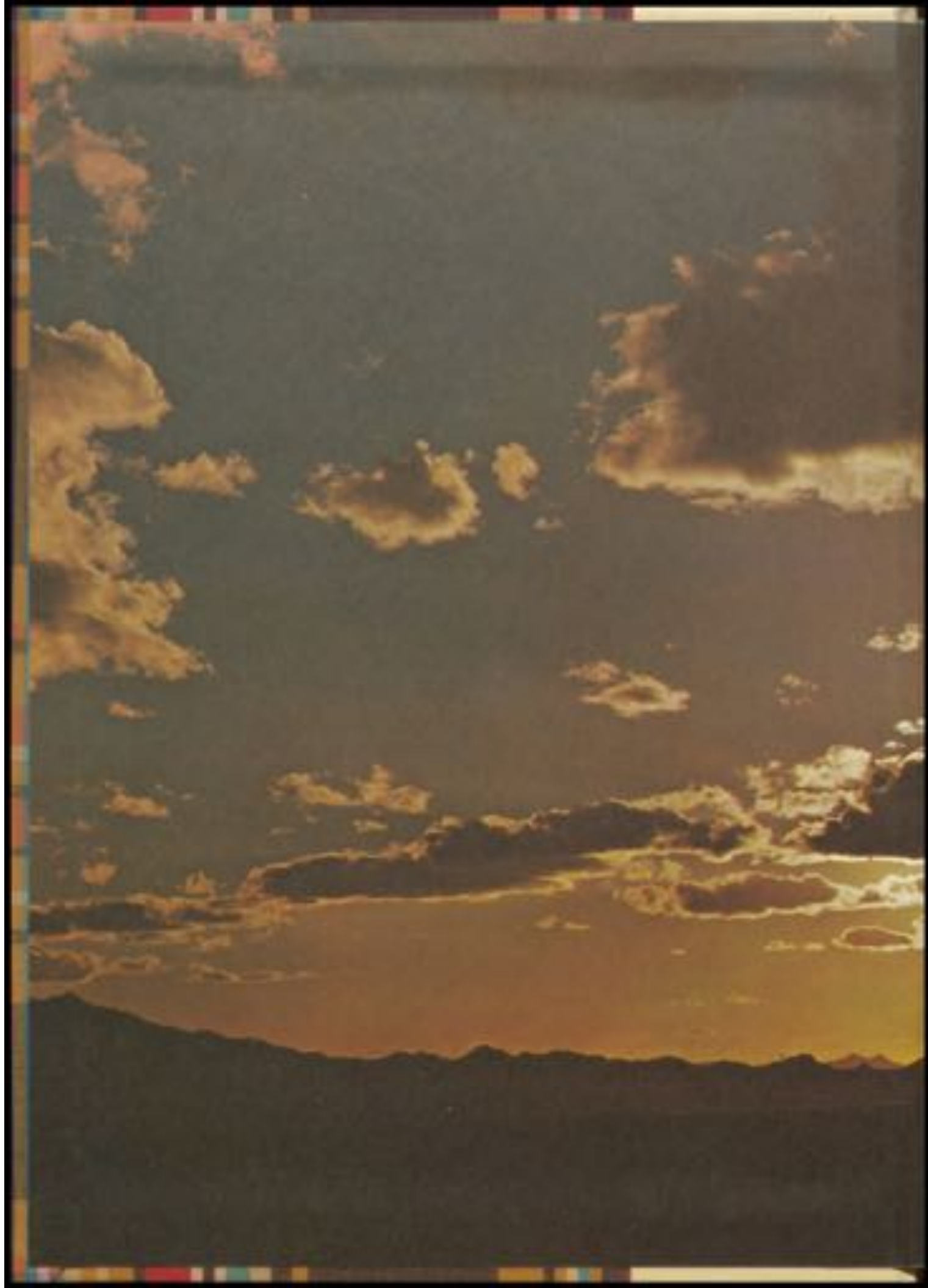

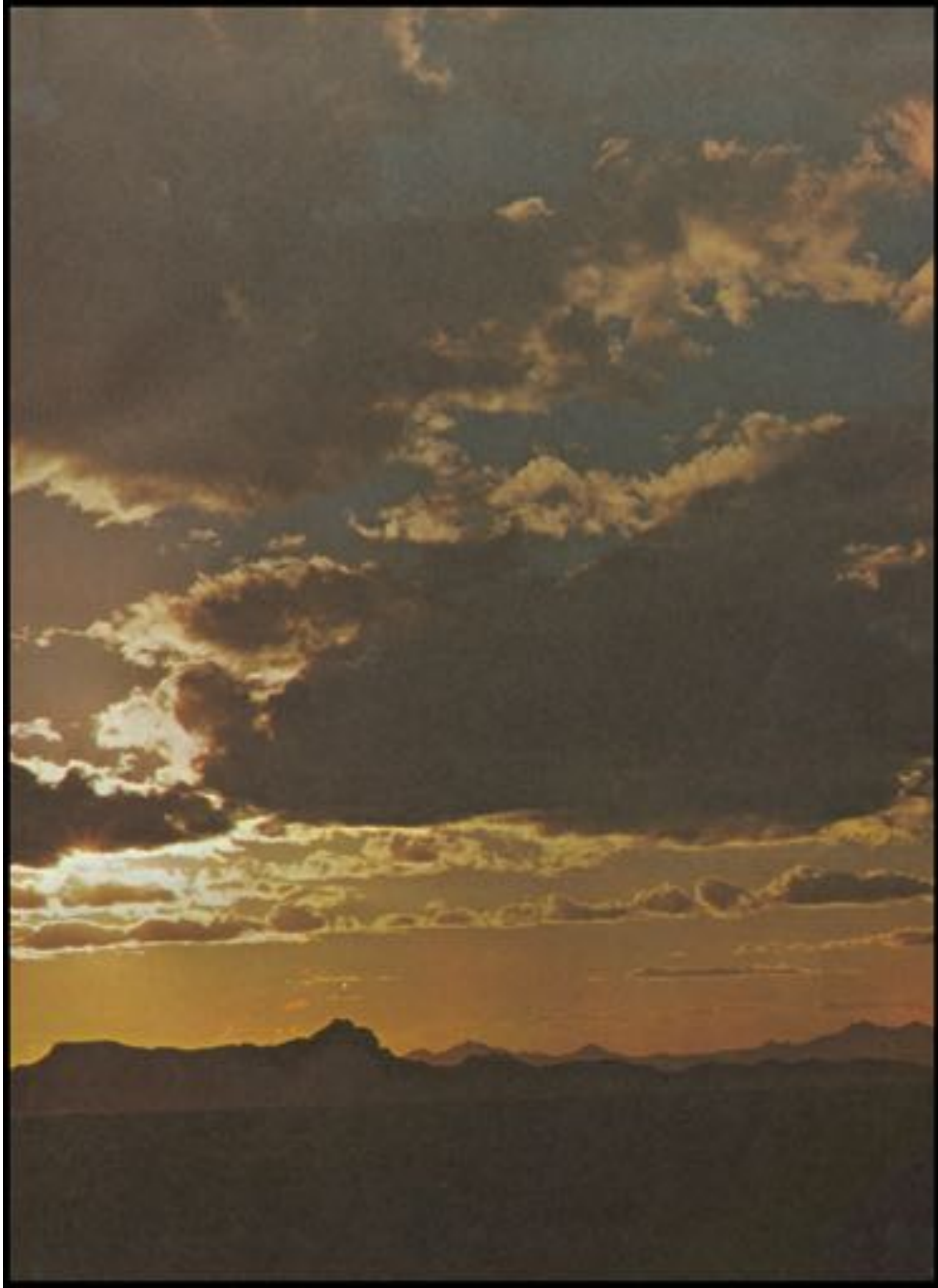

Our total membership consists of 66 active members, 7 associate members, and 8 honorary Chapter Farmers.

Productive projects provide our members with a learning and an earning experience in agriculture. During the past year, students in Vocational Agriculture completed the following productive projects: 28 members--136 market litters; 4 members--10 purebred litters; 8 members--357 head of feeder pigs; 11 members--50 beef feeders; 5 members--21 beef cows; 6 members--58 ewes; 5 members--12 dairy cows; 15 members--463 acres of crops; and 1 member--500 cockerels. The average productive project per member was 1.4; the average labor income was \$924.66.

Our members exhibited livestock at Odebolt Community Fair, Sac County Fair, Sac City Market Hog Show, Ida County Fair, and State Fair in Des Moines.

New addition to the program included selling "Slow Moving Vehicle" signs at cost to farmers and members in the community, and the distribution of one hundred official FFA calendars to members and business places. We also have established a \$1,000 loan fund for students to borrow money to finance productive projects at 4% interest.

Presently we have 1 Purebred Hampshire gilt, 1 Duroc gilt, and 1 Chester White gilt in chapter gilt chain, which are loaned on contract to members.

Our main sources of income are the sale of 775 boxes of citrus fruit, and the operation of 43 acres of cropland. Total net worth of the chapter on January 31, 1966, is \$5,256.05. Total receipts for the year were \$8,329.74 and total disbursements, \$7,228.95.

Theron Smith and Curtis Johnson were members of National FFA Band; Bob Hemphill and Jim Raasch served as ushers at Iowa State Fair; and Marvin Thies received his Iowa Farmer Degree at State Leadership Conference in Cedar Rapids.

The secretary's, treasurer's, and reporter's Scrapbook received a Gold award at District Contest and secretary's book received a Gold award for the third consecutive year at State Contest. The crop judging team placed first at the Graettinger Grain Show, and we earned second place in the Sac City Welding Contest.

Ralph Griffin, local banker, received the Honorary Chapter Farmer Degree at the annual Parent and Son banquet. A Senior FFA trip was taken through the Ozarks and CCA facilities in Kansas City, by members earning points based on merit system.

During the year, we have expanded various phases of our program and added new items to improve the quality of the program. We have had a busy but a rewarding year.

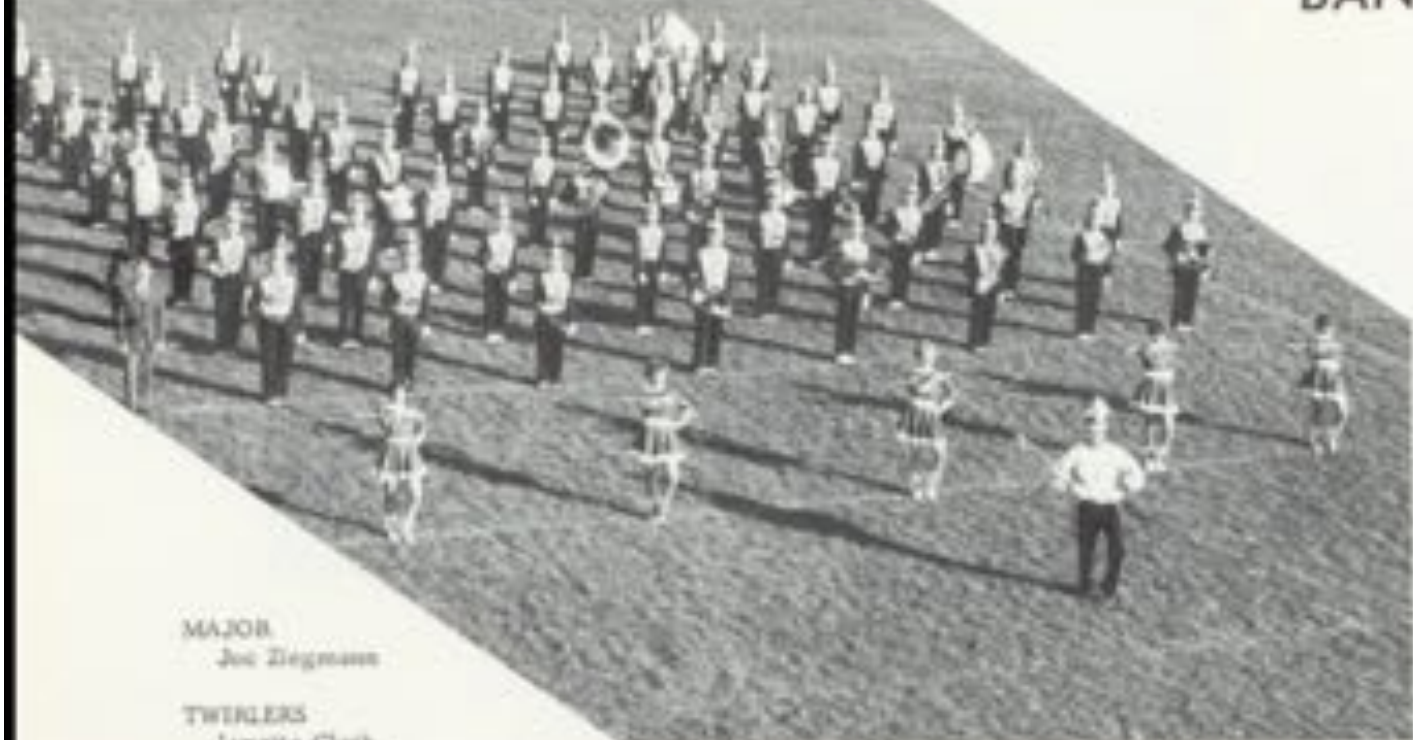

BOYS BASKETBALL

To all these people goes our appreciation for helping to make our yearbook the best yet!

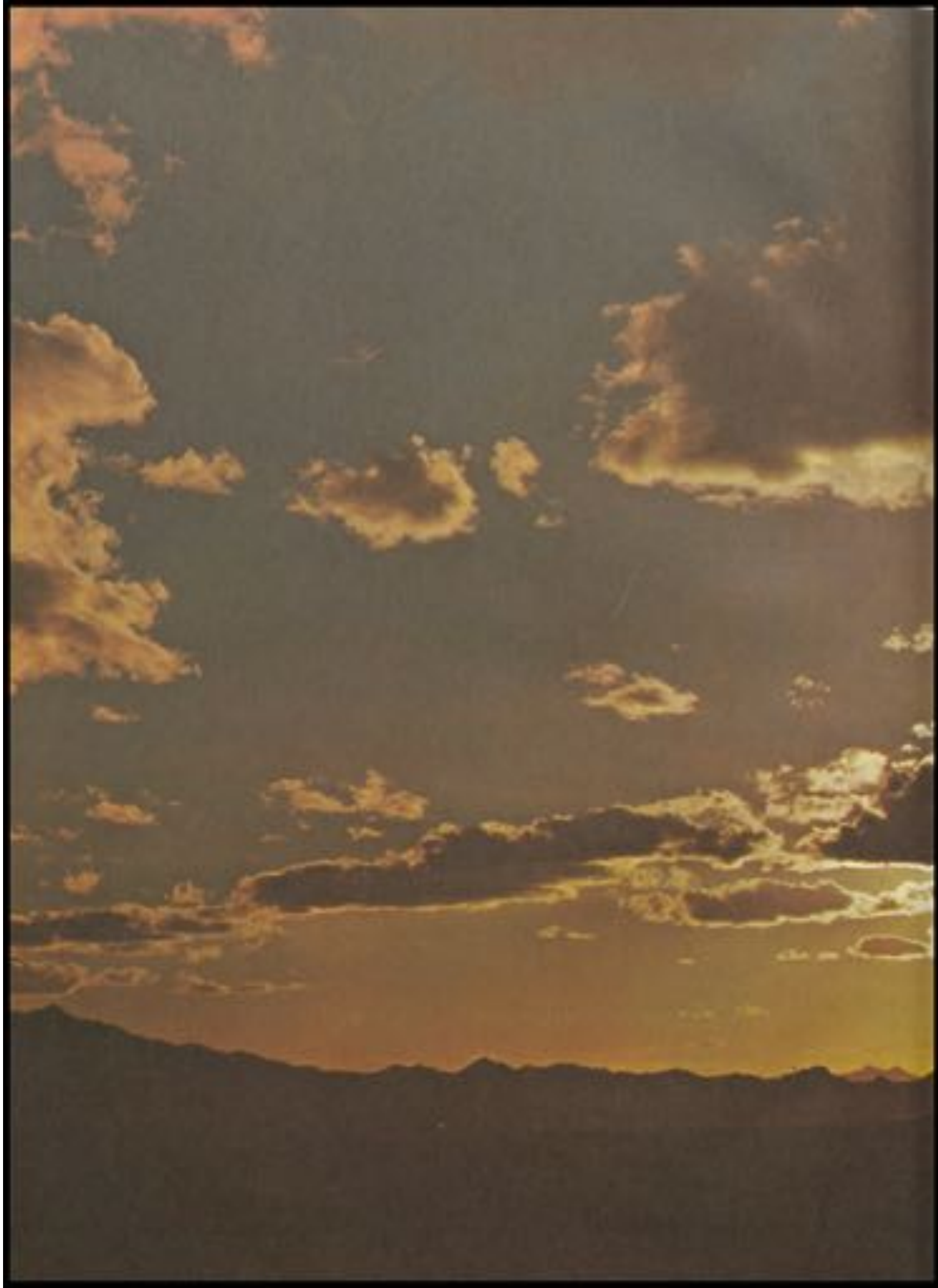

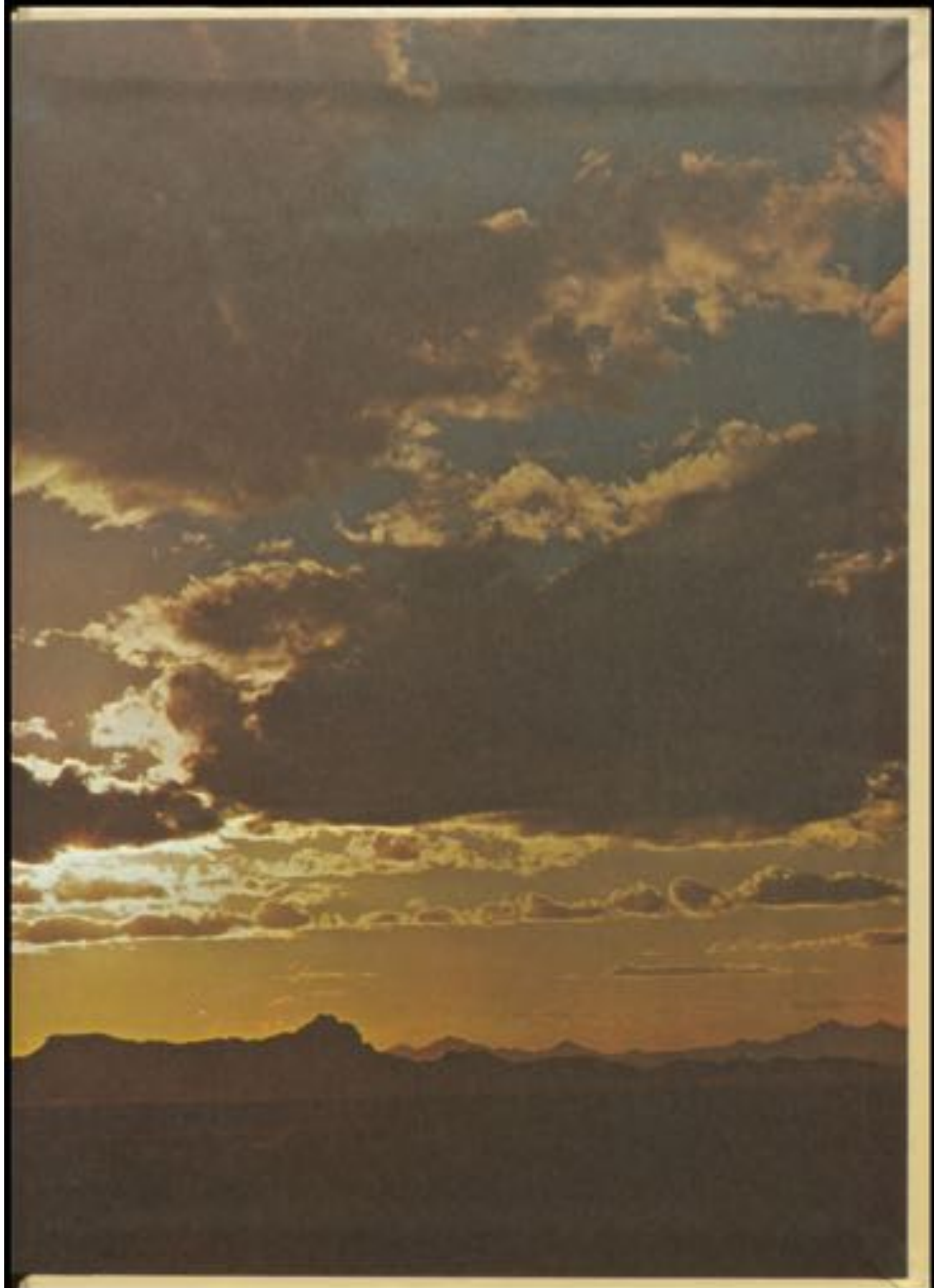
