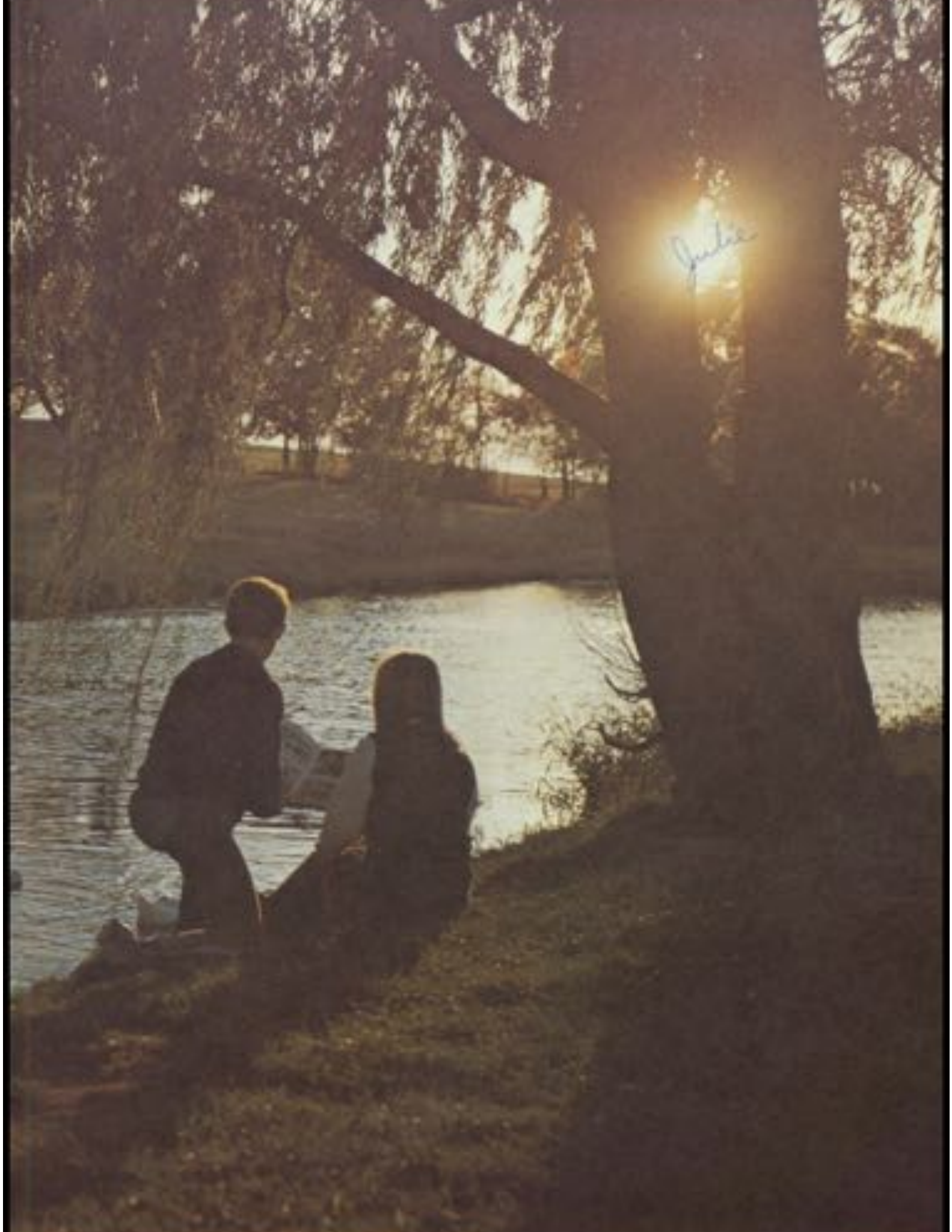


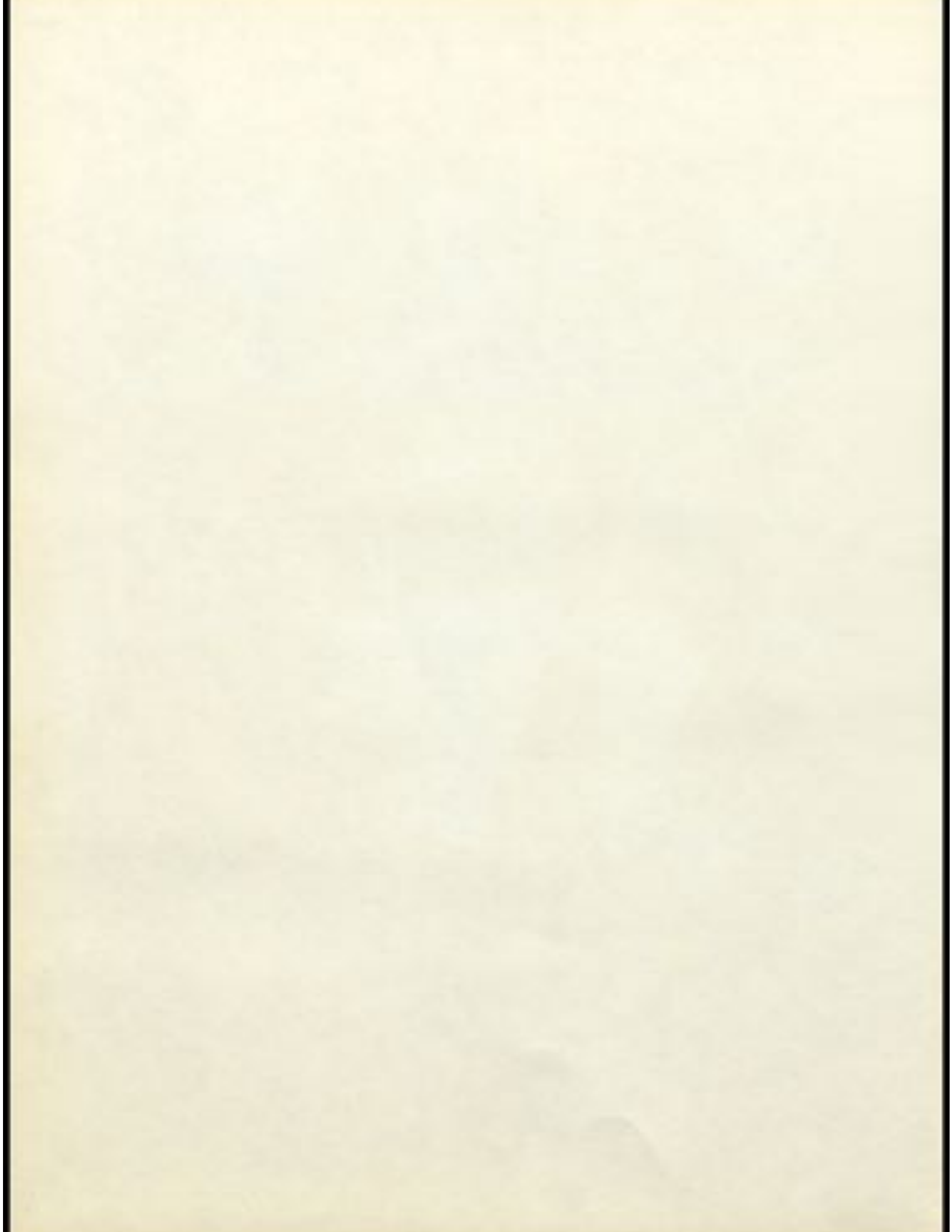

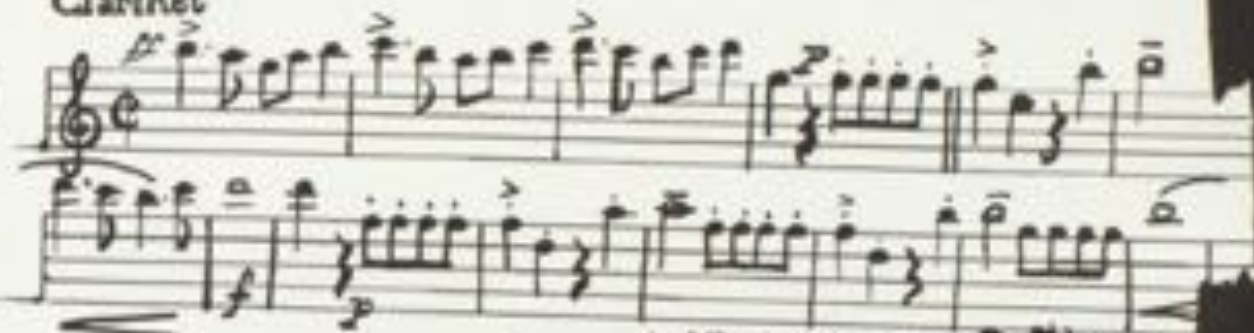

FUTURE FARMERS OF AMERICA

SUPERVISED FARMING: During the past year, we completed the following productive projects: 25 members—243 market hogs, 21 members—1,234 feeder pigs, 17 members—144 beef feeders, 4 members—13 beef cows, 6 members—174 ewes, 15 members—649 acres cropland, 11 members—574 acres corn, 4 members—75 acres soybeans, 1 member—120 bushels, 18 members—18 AGEE. Average productive projects per member is 1.5 and a labor income of \$1,136.92. Total labor income for the chapter is \$65,815.57 and the average labor income per member is \$1,078.98. Ten percent of members exhibited livestock at various fairs and our judging teams represented the chapter well throughout the year.

COOPERATIVE ACTIVITIES: We operate 25 acres of cropland on a 50-50 crop share lease. Members cooperate in promotion of the Odebolt Community Fair and took orders for 720 boxes of citrus fruits. We also cooperated with seed corn companies in conducting a test plot of 42 hybrids on chapter and home farm. We own a share (Class B) in the Coop Elevator and trucked livestock cooperatively to the Iowa State Fair.

COMMUNITY SERVICE. Service to others: cut corn corners at rural intersections and had a demonstration on tractor safety, conducted oats and soybean germination test for farmers and had 400 cemetery flower cans available at cemetery during the Memorial Day. Chemical Safety campaign and program in which 85 farmers attended, established chapter nursery of 190 trees. Service to ourselves: loan fund of \$3,000 for projects.

LEADERSHIP. Fourteen standing committees and work is discussed at regular meetings. Junior FFA is organized in the Freshman Class, presides over one meeting, and meets three other times during the school year. Dekalb Award is presented to senior Vo-Ag members and a creed speaking contest is held in the Freshman Class with a fine membership given to winner along with "Future Farmer Lives Here" sign. Six FFA Foundation Medals were awarded to members for achievement in various areas.

EARNINGS AND SAVINGS. Our chapter is self-supporting with earnings from chapter farm and fruit sales. Income from chapter farm is \$1,699.27 and income from fruit sales is \$1,194.75. Budget is prepared filed with superintendent. Chapter savings investment and balance on hand as of Jan. 31, 1971 - \$2,186.14, total receipts - \$8,259.83, total disbursements - \$6,390.55.

CONDUCT OF MEETINGS. Sixteen regular FFA meetings are held with an average attendance of 92%. Official stationery is used and records of chapter are kept on permanent file in classroom. Officers memorize parts in opening and closing ceremonies and use the official ceremonies in all degree ceremonies. Demonstrations on parliamentary procedure is given at meetings and in the community.

RECREATION. Senior FFA trip is taken in summer by senior members earning points on merit system. Sponsored an all-high-school "Sweetheart" dance and elected a queen. Sixty-eight members and guests attended the hayride in the fall and at a "Fun Night" in February, we played volleyball, basketball, and wrestling; refreshments followed. We showed slides of Senior Trip at a watermelon feed for incoming Freshmen Vo-Ag students.

PUBLIC RELATIONS. National FFA Week activities include: exhibit, dress-up day, posters, and proclamation signed by mayor. Also, had radio programs over KDSN in Denison. Articles of chapter news appeared in the Odebolt Chronicle, District Newsletter, and Iowa Future Farmer Magazine. Malcolm McGrachy received the Honorary Chapter Farmer Degree at a FFA banquet which was attended by 230 members, parents, and guests. Each member received a copy of program of work, copy in libraries, and a copy to honorary members. One-hundred-fifty official calendars were distributed to members and business places in community. Other public relations include: road signs, Future Farmers signs, trash container and wearing of FFA jackets by members.
