The Warriors were among the more than 225 Iowa high schools involved in similar cooperative football sharing programs due to declining enrollments that have reduced the number of participants in the gridiron sport.

The pooling of resources and manpower into what became the "West Central Warriors" football program, injected a renewed spirit of enthusiasm and pride among the three student bodies and communities.

While this new approach was not without the traditional growing pains (including transportation, communication, and scheduling wrinkles), the consensus of three associated with the West Central program was that the broad offering of competition (for all levels 7-12) justified these minor shortcomings when weighed against the "numbers game."

The team name and colors were determined by a popular vote of all three student bodies, and a cheer-leading squad of 12 students (4 from each school) was an impressive spirit booster for the squad. Likewise, the marching bands (also lacking in numbers) made several "combined" appearances during the season.

In 1989, Odebolt-Arthur students (along with their counterparts from Ida Grove and Battle Creek) were proud to cheer for the red, silver, and white West Central Warriors, and winning the Maple Valley Conference championship was an exciting sidelight for the hundreds of local fans that followed the squad each week of the season. 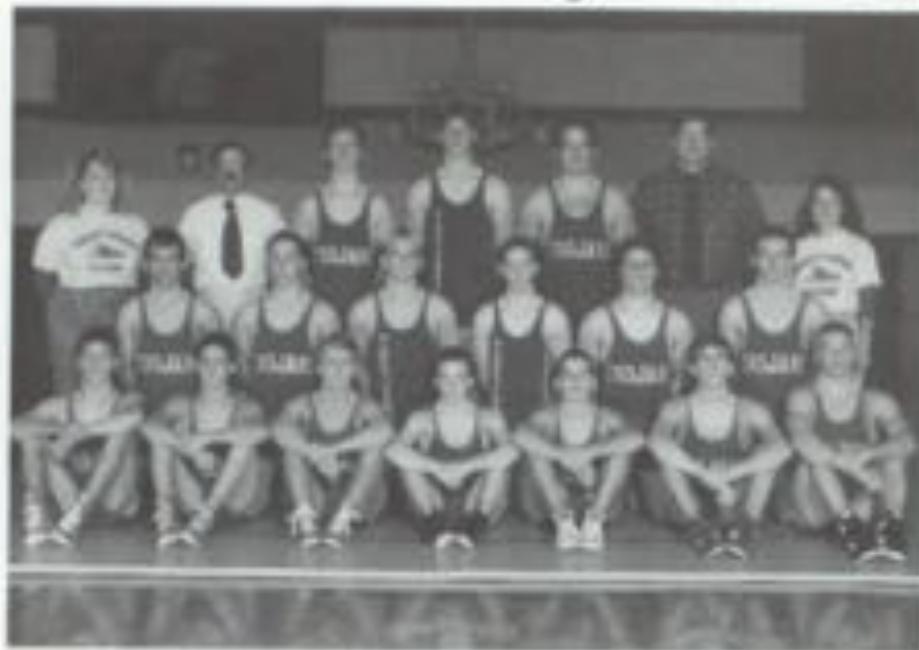

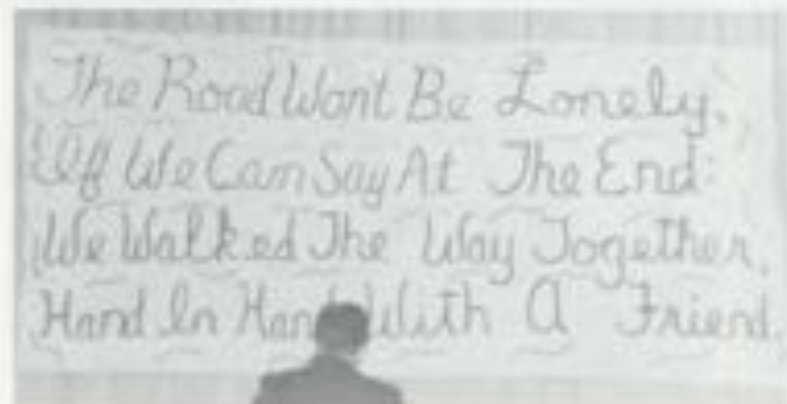


