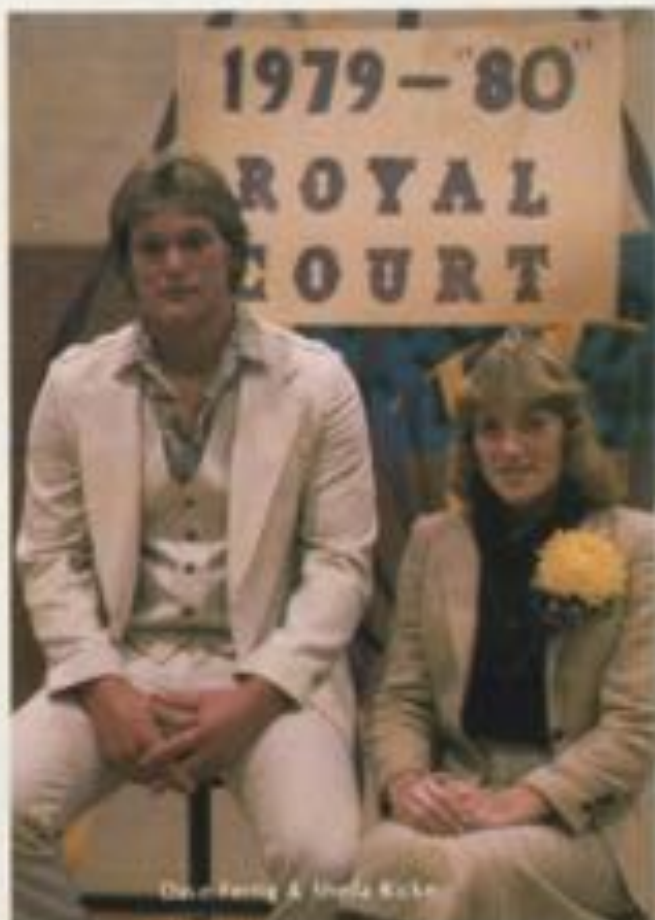

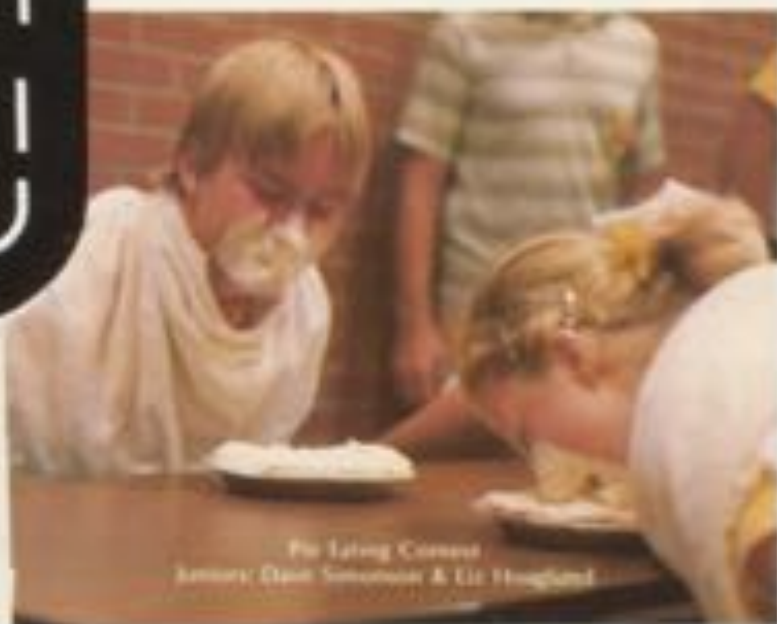

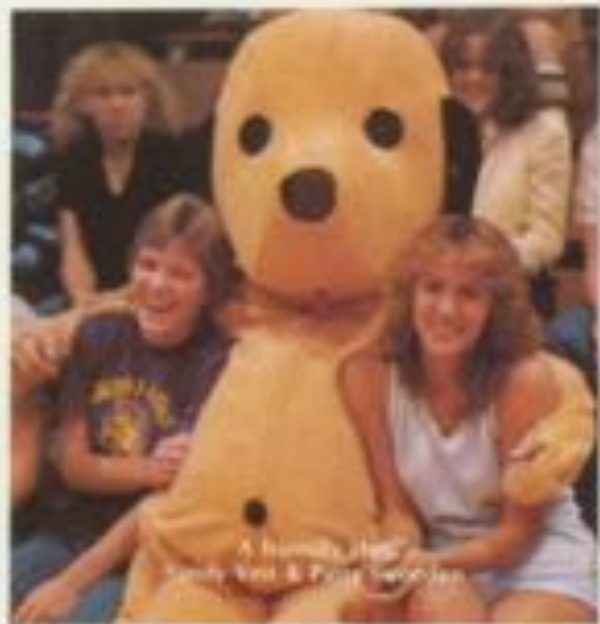


"83 Rules"

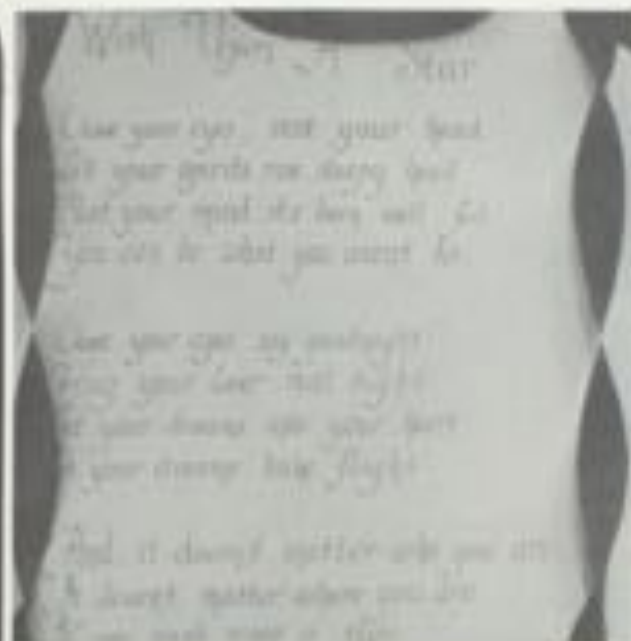

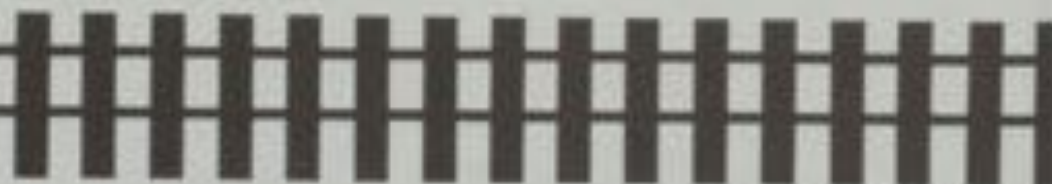

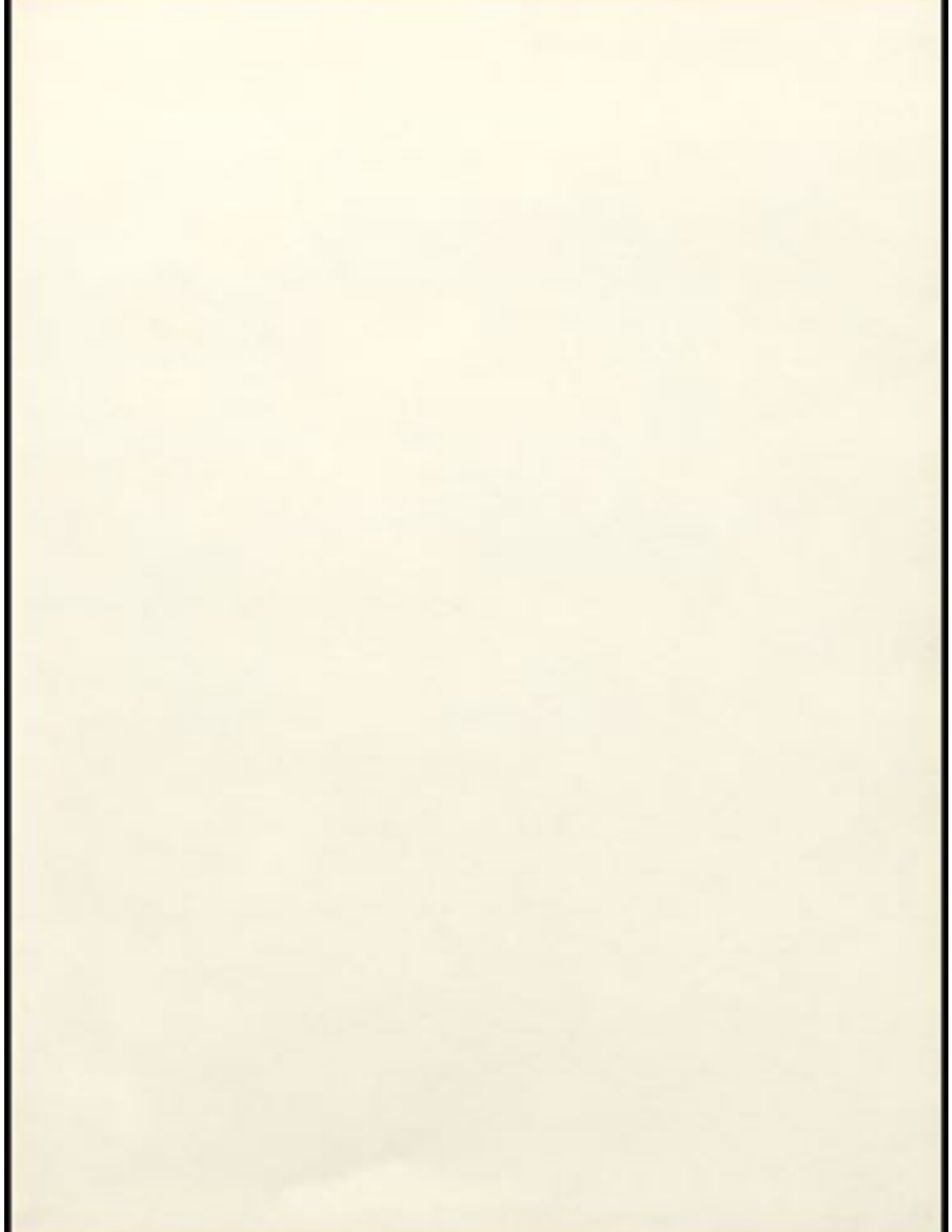
