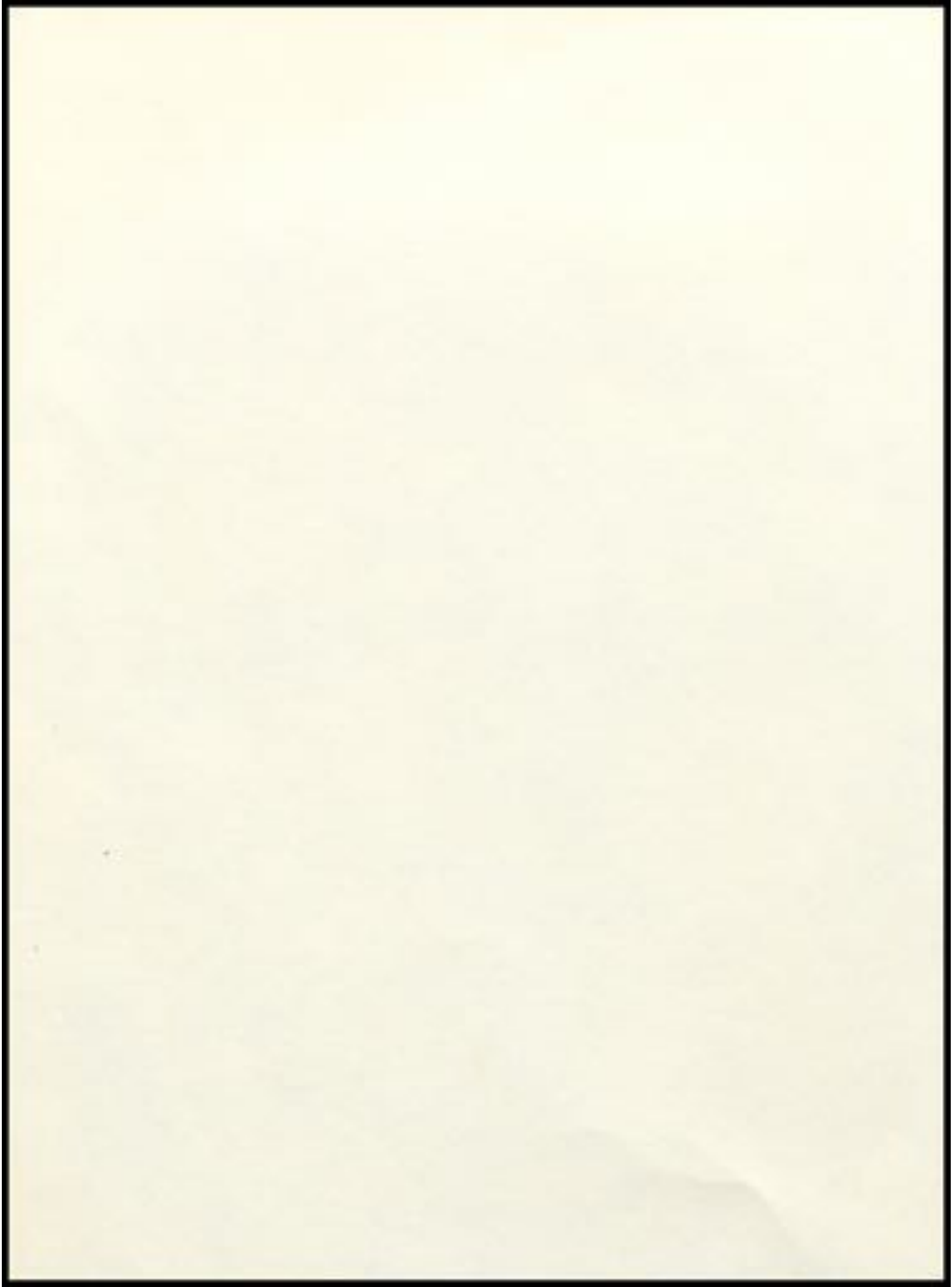

The Bicentennial of the United States Constitution was also in 1986-87. The social event of the year was the wedding of Prince Andrew of Great Britain and Sarah Ferguson. A popular movie was *Top Gun*, starring Tom Cruise and Kelly McGinnes. In the television industry, "The Cosby Show" was voted number one in many polls. Another popular series was "Moonlighting" starring Cybill Shepherd and Bruce Willis. The "hot" car of 1986-87 was the Porsche 911. In clothing trends, mini skirts as well as tea-length dresses made a comeback. The "preppie" style was "in", featuring polo and ivy league shirts, loafers, and boat shoes. Colorful flat shoes for the girls and narrow ties for the boys were popular. Hawaiian-print clothing continued to be in demand. Famous brand names were Pepe, Gervis, Swatch, Coca-Cola Clothes, and Reebok. A 1986-87 stamp cost twenty-two cents, a gallon of gas cost ninety-five cents, and a McDonald's Big Mac cost \$1.29.
