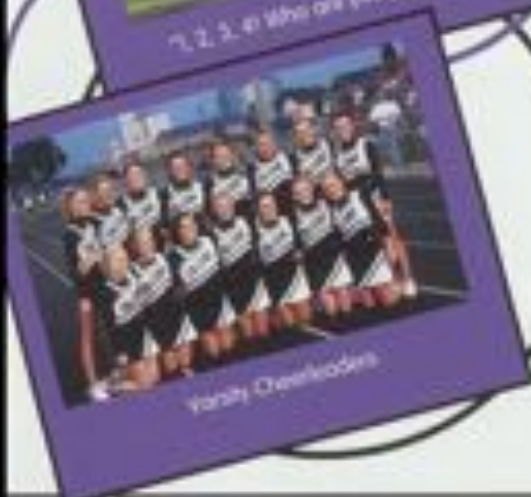

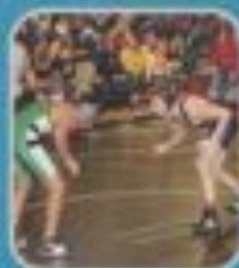

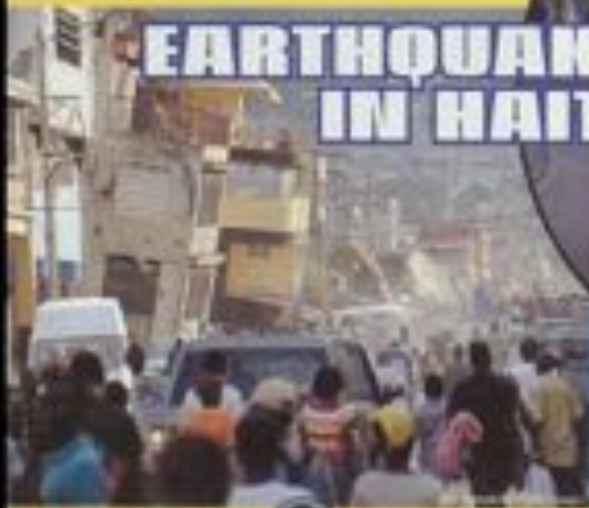
The United States draws closer to providing health care for all with the passage of reform bills in both the House and the Senate.

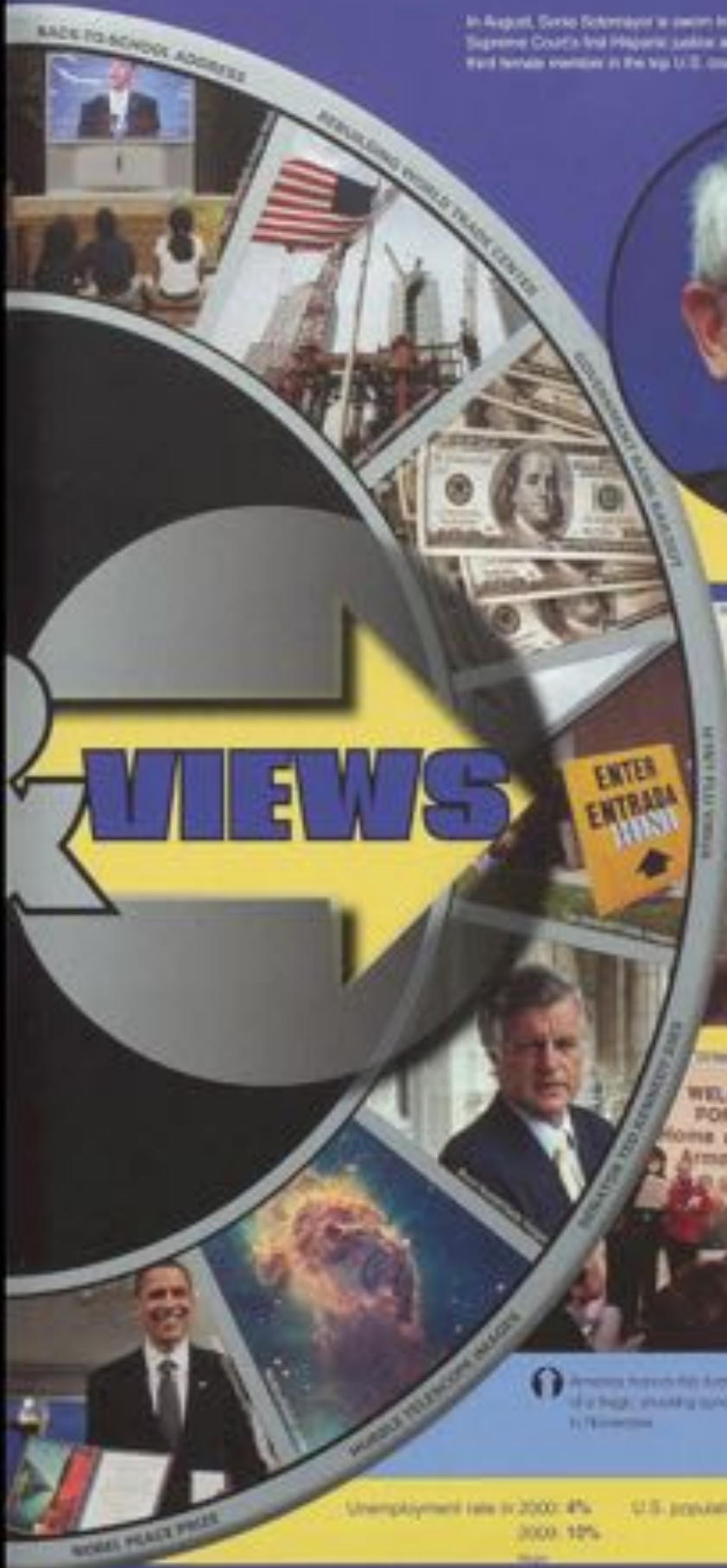

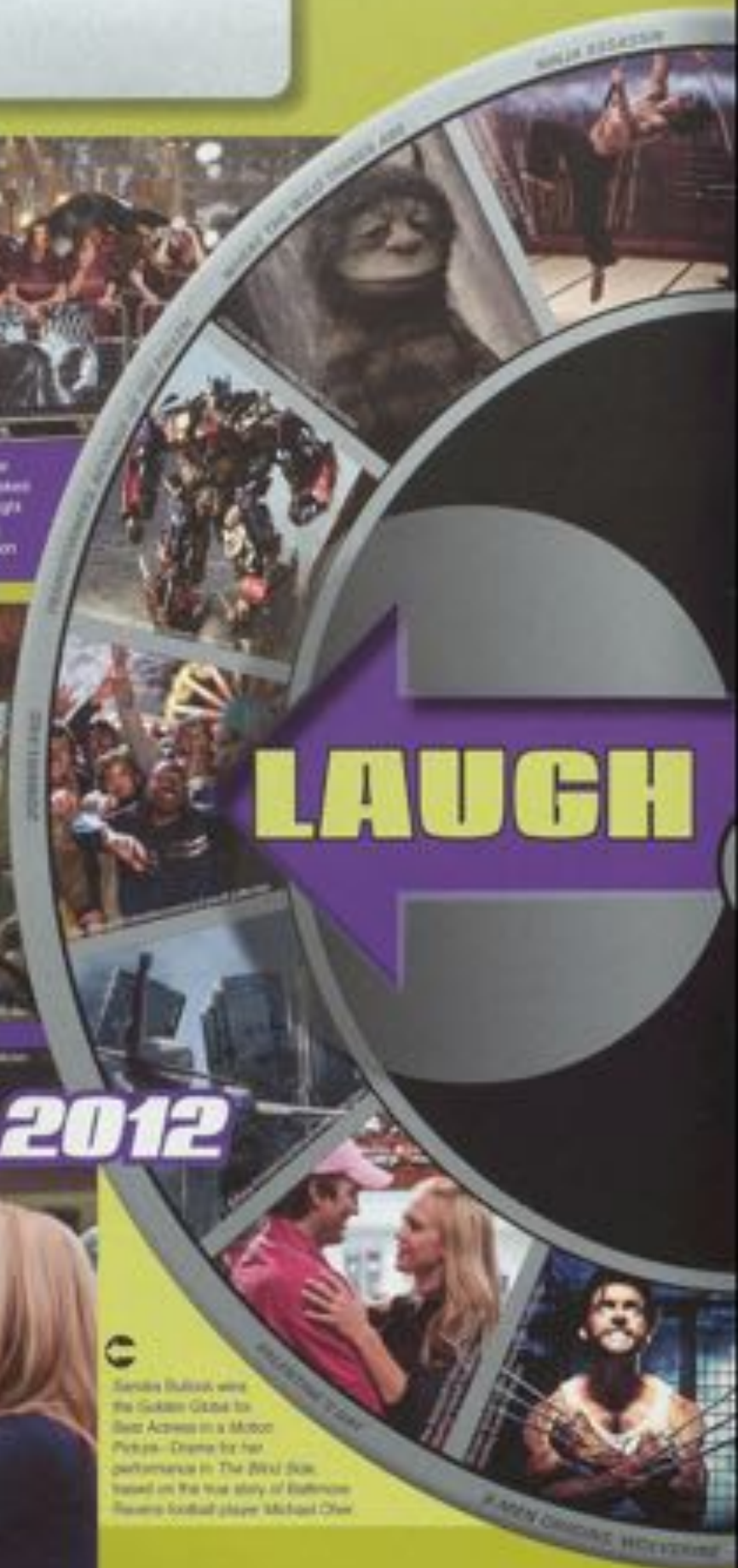
