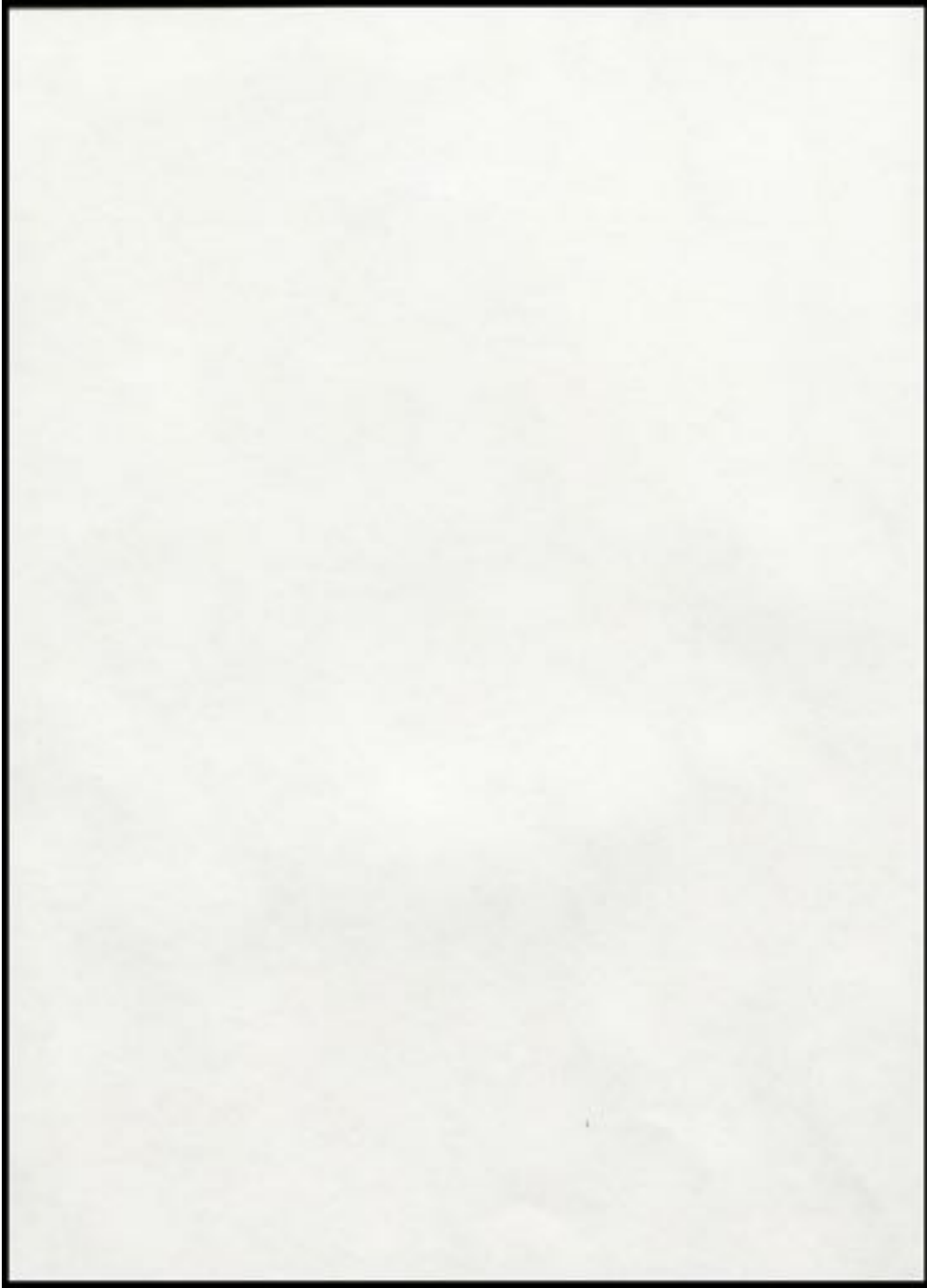

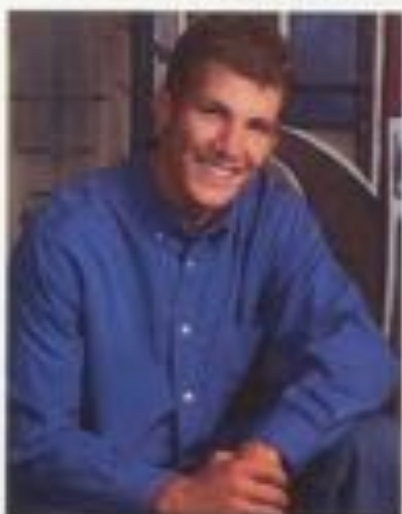

The council also sponsored a food drive for the Sac County Food Pantry. They got about 170 items of food to help the Sac County residents in need of assistance.

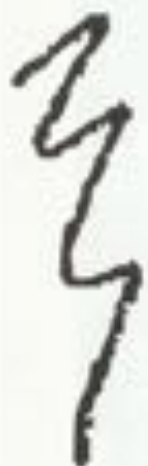

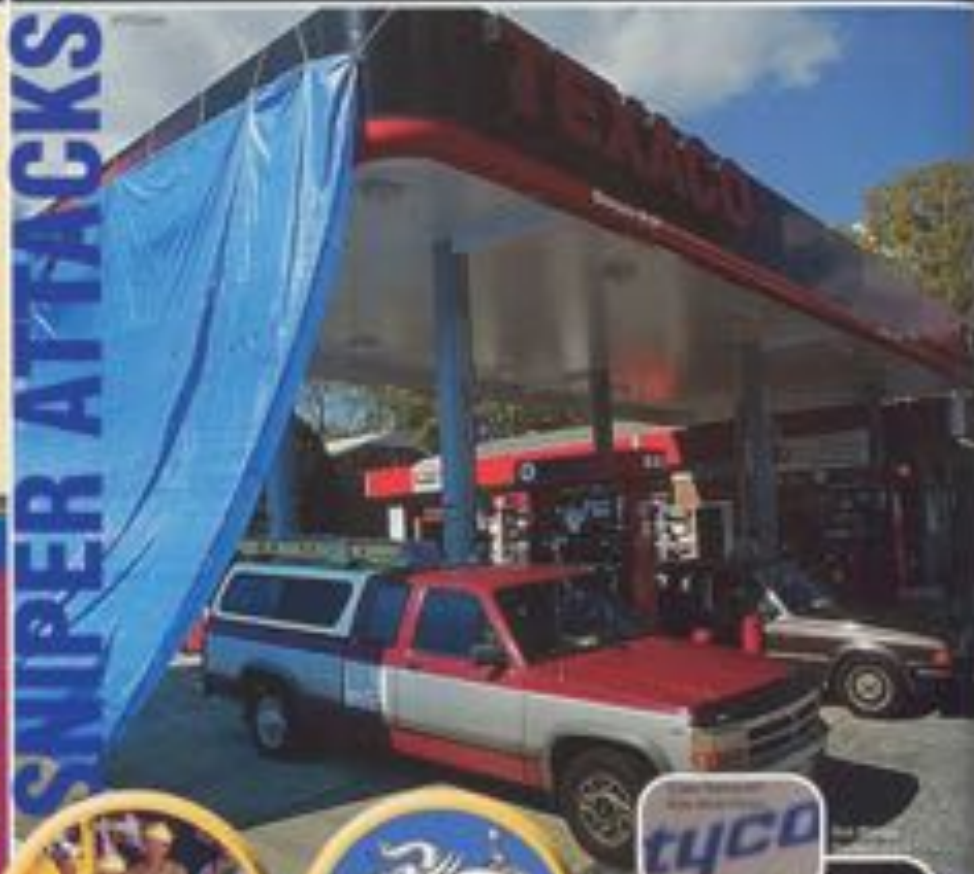

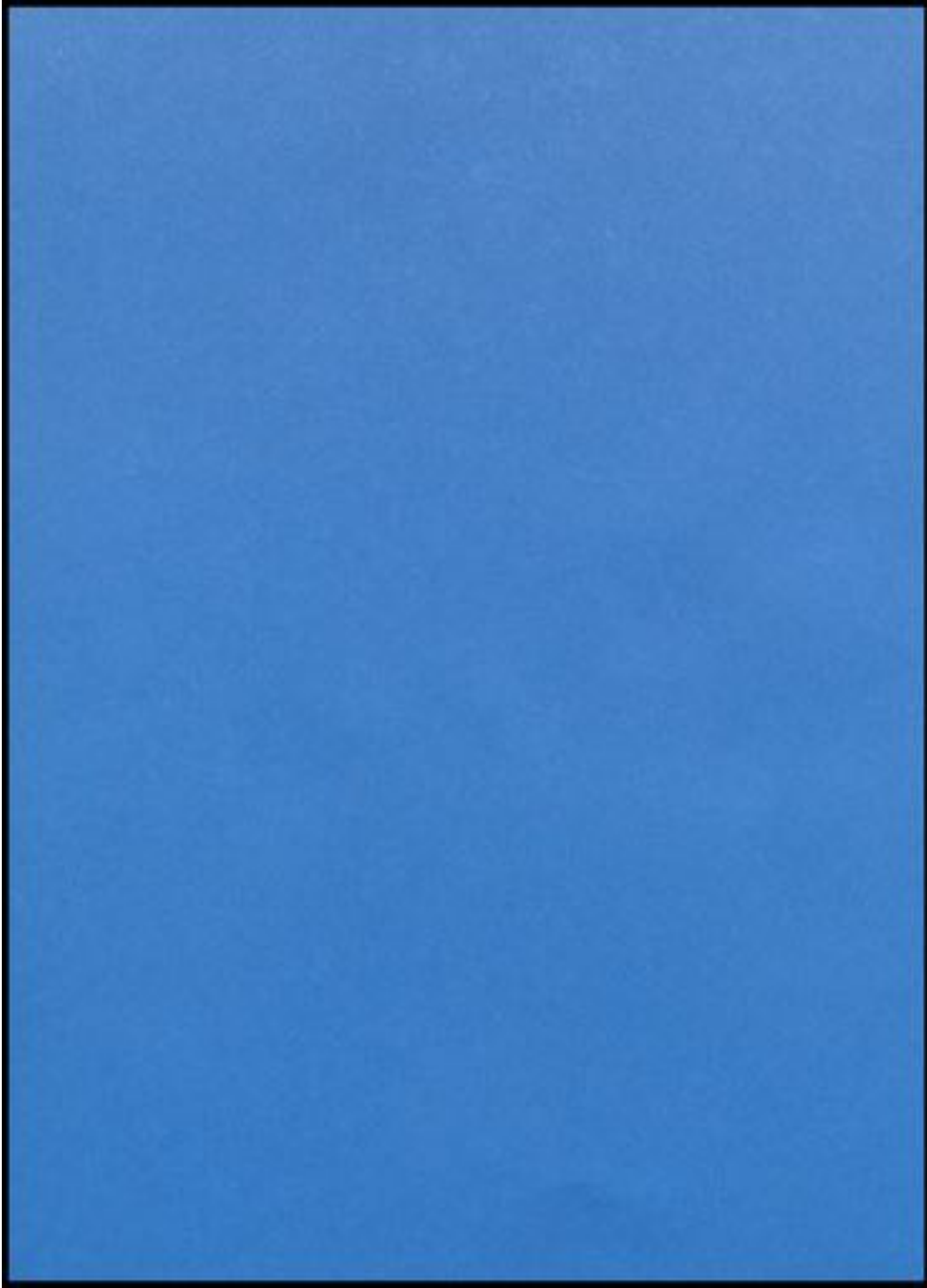
